Last week I read and really enjoyed PARADISE CITY. Actually, I loved it. So as soon as I received the second book, I got stuck into it. I couldn't wait to find out how Lexie's story would end.

Lexie Atkinson has gone back to Red Hill and is heartbroken after Luke Ballantine pretty much dumped her without giving her a chance to explain what the note he read and misunderstood really meant. And what makes matters worse is that her aunty and uncle are moving away from Paradise City, so she won't be going back to finish her last year of high school there. Except, she's almost eighteen and thanks to her zany uncle's idea, she proposes a crazy plan to her parents.

They give her a couple of weeks to find a place to live and get a job to support herself in Paradise City. If she does that, she'll be able to stay there and finish school on her own. However, as soon as she arrives things turn sour. Luke has left Paradise City, her cousin has become friends with Lexie's nemesis, and the only place that comes remotely close to offering her a job is the Wipe Out Bar. The dive owned by Luke's half-brother, Dean Saville. The same guy who looks good but is so frustrating they spend most of the time bickering.

Still, she gives it a go and winds up getting herself into one bad situation after another. How's she supposed to concentrate on school if she can't even get her life straight outside of it? If she can stay out of trouble for just a minute, maybe she'll work it out...

You know what? I didn't enjoy this installment as much as the first.

When I started reading, I once again found myself charmed by Lexie's voice and was instantly hooked into her story. But when she moves to Paradise City and starts on an awkward road back to recapture what she loved about the place so much, I started to realise that the story wasn't working for me. There was something missing. The awesomeness of the first book was gone, replaced with something else. Whereas she soldiered on through all the ups and downs before, now she was totally unravelling and becoming whiny. I didn't like the person she was becoming.

Not to mention that her friend Laura practically disappeared and instead somehow became as unappealing as Amanda & Co were in Book 1. But worst of all was that I didn't buy the romance. No matter how hard I tried to get into it, I just couldn't. Mainly it was because I didn't like Dean. I didn't like him in the first book, and I certainly didn't like him in this one. Reading funks suck, but they exist. And when I fall into one (which is approximately 3 out of 4 weeks in a month), there's certain authors I love to turn to. They're my comfort food - the pizza and the chocolate of the literary world.

I've never been very good with contemporaries - I'm more of a speculative fiction type of girl - but there's something about the way that CJ writes that pulls me into the worlds she creates. There's that familiarity of the Aussie lifestyle that she can capture, whether it's the 90s or today. If the *Paradise* duology were a song, it'd be Thirsty Merc's *In The Summer Time* ([link](#)).

*Paradise Road* takes us back to where it all began and ended, picking up on a high note that lasts the whole book. While a quicker read than the first, *Paradise Road* is a ride that I never wanted to end - specifically because, well, I always preferred Dean Saville, and it was his time to shine.

Lexie had more of a chance to grow in *Road* - gone (for the most part) was the girl of *City* who was whiney and intolerable. At the start of *Road*, Lexie is dealing with the fallout of what happened in *City* - with Ballantine gone and not talking to her, and then her parents dropping the bomb that she may not be able to go back to *Paradise*. Instead of spending too long moping about it - she decides to prove everyone wrong and

land a job and a place to stay.

Ironically, it's The Wipeout Bar that becomes Lexie's new home and the focal setting for the book. And as we know from City, The Wipeout Bar is owned by no other than everyone's favourite brooding boy, Dean Saville. I loved the side of Dean we get to see in Paradise Road. He becomes the centre of the story, and is a real testament to the growth of Lexie. He helps her mature into a young lady, while at the same time pushing past his own prejudices. There were a few times things were glossed over - like the reason he and Ballantine have never gotten along, but really, at the end of the day, I was just happy to have Dean. Gorgeous, perfectly flawed and tender hearted (but shh don't tell him that!)

So basically, if you want something sweet with a touch of sexy, something that you can whip through easily on a day, then read this series. Conveniently, the Wipe Out Bar is looking for employees and with a small room available for lodgings, Lexie is now reluctantly employed by Dean Saville. I waited a long time for this story. I read the first book Paradise City before it was released back in April and had to wait until December for the conclusion. See review of Paradise City [here](#). The first story captured me so therefore I waited not so patiently to see how everything would play out.

I would not recommend this as a stand alone novel. It clearly picks up where the first one ended and without reading the first one the meaning would really be lost. I would also recommend reading them back to back as for me, the distance between the two made me forget parts of the first story.
