Charlotte Adamsland has loved Sanderson Redding her whole life. She was heartbroken when he left to go to school. Now he’s back home and the Civil War is threatening their way of life. Sanderson loves Charlotte and wants to marry, but the threat of imminent war persuades him to enlist in the Confederate Army. Right before he is to leave for his assignment, he asks Charlotte to marry him. They are married in front of the whole town and have a one-night honeymoon.

During the war, Sanderson is captured and ends up in a prison camp in Alton, Illinois. There he finds his brother, who is a Union soldier. Conditions are not very good in camp and there is an outbreak of smallpox which decimates the prisoner population. Sanderson’s brother dies and Sanderson puts on his Union uniform and flees the prison.

In the meantime, Charlotte has received word that Sanderson has been killed in a prison break and she decides to go after him and bring him home. Of course he is not dead and they finally meet up as they travel.

I am a romance junkie, and Sara Barnard's historical romance set during the Civil War satisfied my addiction. It's been awhile since I've read a romance set during this time in America's history. *A Heart on Hold* was a very enjoyable read from cover to cover. The pacing of the book was just right, juxtaposing suspenseful situations with sweet moments of romance. Ms. Barnard has a smooth narrative voice that is easy to read. The author adds just enough descriptive details to give the reader a good idea of living and loving in a war torn country.

On the brink of the Civil War, Sanderson returns to Arkansas from the east and pledges to marry his childhood sweetheart, Charlotte. Before they can arrange their wedding, the country is embroiled in a Civil War. Sanderson leaves with his regiment only to return home nearly dead from pneumonia. Charlotte nurses him back to health, and the two are married before he returns to the front lines. When Sanderson is captured and imprisoned at the prisoner of war camp in Alton, Illinois, Charlotte packs a few provisions and heads north to find him. The book relates her adventures and misadventures on her journey to find him, as well Sanderson's adventures and misadventures in escaping from the prison camp.

The narrative is filled with secondary characters Ms. Barnard weaves in and out of the story line, giving the book texture and interest. From Sanderson's brother Jackson who enlisted in the Union army to the band of traveling gypsies hired as healers at the prison camp to the Irish noble woman wandering around in the woods to the encounter with Harriet Tubman in an isolated area of Arkansas to the mixed race boy who can't find his place in the white or Indian community, the author presents a group of memorable characters.

But it was the two main characters, Charlotte and Sanderson, I found myself cheering onward. I felt Charlotte's joys and fears, her longing for her beloved Sanderson, and especially her determination to find him even when looking for him seemed hopeless. I experienced the prisoner of war camp right along with Sanderson. The relationship between the two brothers, Sanderson and Jackson, was touching. The author wrote compassion and humanity in their personalities, something I often find missing in the typical alpha male romance hero. This book as a stand alone truly has a happily ever after ending. Wow - talk about a non-stop adventure! *A Heart on Hold* never stops to rest - it's an exhilarating ride. The story of Charlotte and Sanderson, childhood sweethearts during the American Civil War. He goes away to war, gets captured, and she sets off, without a qualm, to bring him back home. The author has a firm grasp of history, historical figures, and also small details -- herbs used to treat a black widow bite, causes and repercussions of a host of ailments -- that make this story come alive. The women in this book are role models -- vulnerable (and therefore, relatable) but strong and willing to risk anything for their loved ones and their faith -- all the things they strongly believe in. I listened to the Audible version of *A Heart on Hold* by Sara Barnard, which is a historical romance story set during the Civil War. The story starts off with Sanderson returning to Arkansas after attending West Point

and pledging to marry his childhood sweetheart, Charlotte, when the war is over. However, Sanderson returns home nearly dead from pneumonia and they are married after Charlotte nurses him back to health. After returning to his regiment, Sanderson goes missing and is presumed dead, so Charlotte heads north to find him. In true romance fashion, a happy ending comes after many trials and tribulations.

Many of the settings and surrounding descriptions are very detailed and believable. And Sara Barnard made a few of the characters extremely sweet and likable, especially little Cotton who was a little orphan Indian boy.
