In the book The Clique, by Lisi Harrison, Massie Block, who is very rich, has a group of 3 best friends - Alicia, Dylan, and Kristen. For example, they have a sleepover, and when Alicia asks Claire if she snores, Kristen says that Claire farts. They start laughing while Claire is turned around in her sleeping bag, sad. Also, Massie and her clique start a cosmetic company, leaving Claire out.

Most of the time when Massie and her friends are mean to Claire, she gets sad. A couple times she snaps back at Massie/stands up for herself. Eventually, Claire gets mad enough to sabotage them back. Every night when Massie goes on her walk, Claire sneaks into Massie's room and chats with her friends on her computer, pretending to be Massie. One time when Massie comes to school, her friends are mad at her. Then she figures it out with her friends and one of her friends calls Claire while all of them are on the phone. When her friend says bye, they all do too.

Massie has a crush on a freshman named Chris Abeley, and meets him to ride horses. Claire and Chris' younger sister Layne become friends. Claire finds out that Chris Abeley is Layne's brother and that he has a girlfriend.

At the party that Massie's dad hosts, Fawn, Chris' girlfriend, is there, and Massie loses interest in him. Massie meets another boy who asks her to dance. Then both Massie's dad and Claire's dad come to the stage to do a dance and call Massie and Claire to come up there with them. However, Claire grabs Massie's hand and they run to a bush to hide. They end up talking and having fun while becoming friends.
