Can we just start with mentioning that the covers on all the books are so eye-catching! The bright colors and the interesting character positioning originally drew me in and I knew I wanted to read a book that could so quickly captivate me just by being so interesting- and that is without knowing what the book was even about. This is not even a little bit a standalone series, the books must be read in order to fully understand the world as well as all the altering relationship dynamics and conflicts between the characters. I thought this second book in the Emerge series was fine. Not fantastic, but fine.

The story was well written and flowed well. It was also well-edited. The author is adept at giving each character their own voice and personality. That said, I didn't feel the same kind of connection with Allie and her friends as I did with the first story. Characters that had more central roles before seemed shoved into the background for most of the book. In addition, I could have done without the teen drinking and sex, especially the female character that seemed intent on dating her way through many of the men in one family, but that's really just a personal preference.

The story also seemed a little too laden with foreshadowing and teen angst. All in all, this book didn't really feel like it advanced the story as much as it could have. But then the first book set the bar very high. I'll probably keep following the story, though I won't be quite as excited to read the next one as I was to read this one.

But the Judgment? I was so excited for the opportunity to receive an advanced copy of this book. I've been dying to find out what happens next. The things that bugged me in the first book weren't an issue at all. The pace wasn't bogged down by so many stories, but there were still some great (short) backstories that fit into the book really well. The book takes off in the first chapter and hits its stride quickly and doesn't let up until the end.

For those readers who hated Vince in the first book (like me), you will be very happy with the Judgment. He's not gone, but he makes SO much more sense now. Looking back I can see what the author intended with his character and I'm excited to see what role he will play in the rest of the series.

I struggled with the huge cast of characters in the first two books, but the author has focused on the most important characters for this book, leaving some of the excessive characters to fade into the background. (I also read Emerge the Scholar right before this so that might have cleared up some of my confusion too)

Aiden and Allie show a lot of growth in this book as the stakes are much higher this time. In the Judgment readers will get a much bigger picture of where this series is headed and I can't wait for the next one.

YA Urban Fantasy is overrun with books about shifters, witches, angels and demons. But Craven's immortals are one of a kind. Add this series to your TBR for 2017, you will not be disappointed.

This second book of the Emerge series resumes a few months after the first book's story concludes, and follows up well. It answers several questions, is a full novel in itself, and still leaves us waiting for more. I thought the writing was better in this book, with fewer issues as far as giving me context and with the secondary characters coming to life. Also, the love triangle is less of an issue in this book, although it still irritated me. Allie's relationships with boys in general irritates me. 'I don't want to commit and I want to make sure I'm my own person without being connected to a man' is wonderful, especially for a teenager for goodness' sake (I'm rolling my eyes right now about another (very famous) series that I compare this one too, where the heroine just really wanted me to smack her around and put her in therapy), but I don't think it should be followed with 'but maybe we could just have sex because I think I'm ready for that'. Anyway, more on that at the bottom of the review.

Overall this story was cool, exciting, with neat characters and interesting super powers. The characters have flaws and struggle to overcome, mostly without being depressive or whiney.

Language: Very mild.

Violence: There's fighting and craziness, but I don't remember anything super explicit.

Sexual Content: Religious upbringing aside, if people want to think they're mature and ready for major decisions like sex, shouldn't they think about possible consequences? On the male character side of things in this book it's even worse. 'I'll just sleep around because the girl I really want doesn't want me right now, and I'm not going to deny my hormones just because I'm in love with someone else.' And then for the girls to be OK with that...I know I have biases on this topic, and I'm pretty comfortable with them, but it's a fact that there are a lot of emotions at play when it comes to intimacy of different degrees, and a lot of risks as well. Maybe because these characters are immortals they don't have to be concerned about some things, but since this is a young adult story I think those things should have been addressed. Sex without intimacy or commitment is a real trend, made popular by the many who want to take what they can get and feel they owe nothing, but I JUST CAN'T STAND IT. On the bright side, this part of the story wasn't nearly as forefront as it might have been, and I was able to roll my eyes and move on to enjoy the others.

Diversity: OK, this point is weird. There is definitely a variety of characters, but often I can't remember what they look like or anything because it simply isn't mentioned very often, and there are too many characters for me to remember them all. Some of them I remember are Asian because of their names, but that's about it.

Overall Message/Plot: I like the focus on independence and how Allie wants to make sure she's not being half a person by relying on guys. I just wish she stuck with it longer because the fact is that she has a long way to go before she's really mature, but I've said enough about that. Although it does have interesting characters it's more plot driven with lots of action and a little mystery about what is going to happen, and it does that pretty well. I enjoyed it enough that I intend to get the next book when it comes out.

Ever since Liam had started working with her on her dreams, she dreamed often of fire and rage—of a bloody world filled with darkness and fear, and so much anger. But it never coalesced into anything she could understand. The terror continued to plague her with no

end in sight. But this dream was different. She could hear screams echoing in the forest, but she couldn't seem to find the source.

The Judgment, which I believed, picked up shortly after the end of the first book in the series, *The Awakening*, where the female protagonist, **Allie** was fully awakened by the age of 16. She experienced the transformation from an innocent mortal to a soon-to-be powerful clairvoyant in this book and at the same time, discovered some hidden secret of her real parents and mysterious bond with **Aiden** (whom was supposed to be her equal, lover and soul mate)'s OLDER BROTHER, **Darius**.

"Knock it off, Allie," Darius said. "You're going all glassy-eyed again and it's kinda obvious you aren't talking to me."

"Sorry."

"Is her freaking?"

"Not really, just trying to keep his lunch down."

"Come on, us making out is not that disgusting."

"He can feel what I'm feeling. So just then it was kinda like he was the one making out with you."

"No. No. No. Unsay it, Red. Please unsay it."

"Next time give me a little warning and I'll block him."

To be honest, I didn't think much happened in this instalment because apparently, Allie was still trying to familiarize herself with her newly developed supernatural ability and spent most of the time figuring out what her freaky dreams were indicating.

The book slipped off her lap and crashed to the floor, jarring her from the waking vision. All this time, she'd seen the forest and the orchard in her dreams and she's just dismissed it as nothing of importance. But this was different. Allie's clairvoyance was trying to warn her. Her dreams weren't just junk anymore.

She was like a blind clairvoyant and half of the book focused on her exploration of the dreamscape she walked on every night, where she met her absent father who appeared to be a professional dreamwalker, guiding her through this imaginary place.

"And when you enter the world of dreams, do not ever leave your own dreamscape. This is very important, Allie. This world is infinite and it is very easy to get lost here when you are not a dreamwalker. It could drive you mad if you found yourself trapped in someone else's dreamscape."

As much fun as it was to visit these interesting realms with Allie, **I would appreciate more if the author dug further into the inescapable fate of Allie and other superpower friends.** In other words, I was more concerned about what they were going to encounter after Allie could control her ability. I knew they were in trouble since there were lots of snobs out there, hunting for the rare breed of immortals like Allie, in order to take advantage of them and do what-I-had-no-idea.

Aside from the fact that this story put little emphasis on Allie and her friends' future, there were still some

elements I adored in the book. For example, **the strongest feature of Allie was her fierceness as a female character despite her naivety and innocence. She was the perfect representative of a feminist and what attitude women should have under whatever circumstances.** Her feisty personality had made a great impression on me since the first book and now it only brought out the awesomeness in her even more.

"I don't want to *need* any guy. I don't want to be the girl who can't figure her own shit out so she uses her boyfriend as a crutch to lift herself up."

Moreover, I'd already shipped Allie and Aidan so much in book one, this instalment took their ~~romantic~~ relationship up a notch and reached another exciting new level. What they had wasn't exactly swoony or heart-melting but I had faith in them and believed both of them would find the way to each other as the story unfolded.

No matter what happens between us, we will always be more than just friends. We will always be equals. It would break my heart to lose you, but you're part of me now. The best part of me. No matter where life takes us, we will always have that.

Last but not least, this entire series was like a beautiful combination of several books from my favorite authors. Allie reminded me of Celaena Sardothien/Aelin Galathynius from the Throne of Glass series by Sarah J. Maas so much because both of them were such badass female role models and both had symbolic tattoos around their scars.

He frowned down at the intricate drawing of vines and flowers. He changed his attitude when he saw the lines of poetry she'd worked into the black and purple vines that would follow the path of her scars. It all spoke of positive body image and accepting her perceived imperfections as part of the unique and beautiful person she was, inside and out. It was a message to herself. She didn't want to let the ugly scar affect her anymore, she was ready to embrace it as the badge of honor it was.

This series also reminded me of Jennifer L. Armentrout's Obsidian series in that all the main characters had alien-like powers to conquer the world. Besides, Aidan's healing power, Naomi's space-creating ability and Darius's hearing others' thoughts power were pretty similar to those in Michelle Hodkin's The Unbecoming of Mara Dyer trilogy. Despite the fact that this series and other books were so much alike at some point, I still loved it nonetheless. The characters in *The Judgment* were lovable and they had their own uniqueness that I appreciated.
