It has lots of action and holds your interest. There isn't a ton of pictures, but the few it does has are nicely done. It has a great Christmas feel to it and could become a Christmas favorite. I could see it developing into a series.

I received this book through GoodReads First Reads. I'm sorry but I didn't like it. It's boring and none of the characters developed enough. "Santa" on the cover is actually a pirate dressed as Santa. Although the book is about pirates saving Christmas for a town the story lacked the Christmas feel that most Christmas stories have (for instance The Polar Express.) The only time it feels like a Christmas story is at the very end but it just takes too long to get there.

There's a lot of uncommon, advanced pirate wording that goes on and it left me confused as to what was even going on much of the time. Young listeners are going to lose interest as the vocabulary is really high and it drags on too much too often. I'm not just talking about a few odd pirate words here and there; it's nearly every page. For instance sentences such as *"Electric blue boomers reared above the formast."*

I think it would have fared better as a short picture book. I gave it two stars because the illustrations are good (though there aren't nearly enough) and the pages look old which is cool.
