Darcy, having enough of living in the shadows of her football famous Dad and brother, relocated due to a job. Much to her surprise, and reluctance, her boyfriend, Jake aka Turtle, moved with her. Darcy knew almost immediately Jake wasn't the best choice, but she stayed with him through a lot of bad situations. That is until Jake got a little too hands on with his anger. Darcy needs to get away and decides a little road trip is the type of therapy she needs. Of course, it's hard to leave your troubles behind when they literally follow you.

As Darcy is enjoying a meal in Lonely Pine, a lovely little town she happened upon when her car broke down, Turtle arrives and causes a scene. The people at Rosie's offer Darcy some much needed support, comfort, and a place to stay. When J.P., the auto repair shop owner, is working on Darcy's car, he discovers how Turtle was able to find her.

Unfortunately, Turtle isn't through harassing her and when he not only gets violent again but essentially tries to kidnap her, Darcy is thankful when Lincoln, the sexy Texas Ranger she saw at the diner her first night in town, intervenes.

It doesn't take long to realize Lincoln and Darcy have a somewhat connected history, though she didn't know him as Lincoln. Not to mention, never in her wildest dreams, and she used to have plenty about him, was he ever reciprocating the attraction she was currently feeling.

Why does Lincoln look so familiar? What happens when he remembers Darcy? Are their feelings for one another physical only? Or is something stronger growing between them? So, on to all the things that I loved about this book.

1. Length. I am a sucker for quick, sexy read and this one fit the bill but it packed a nice wallop in the couple hours it took me to read it.
2. Backstory. I loved the build up of (view spoiler) I'm likewise crazy about books where the heroine finally

says (a la Donna Summer/Barbara Streisand) **ENOUGH IS ENOUGH IS ENOUGH**, packs up her car and leaves that worthless man in her life only to stumble upon the man of her dreams. Mix in an impromptu cross-country road-trip and I'm hooked!

3. Southern Roots. I'm a Southern gal by default. I say default because my daddy was in the military so our family moved all over the world throughout my childhood. However he and my mama were born and bred in South Carolina where they met and fell in love over 50 years ago so while I didn't live in SC officially until 2000, I've said all my life, I may not have been raised in The South but The South was raised in me. I've always had Southern values and I love book that has down home characters and maybe a few good ole boy colloquialisms. Rescue Me, Ranger had a nice little smattering of both. I'm sure there would have been more had the book been longer but still . . . enjoyable.

4. Epilogue. Why don't more authors do epilogues? I love to have a glimpse of the characters' HEA a few years--or as is the case in this book, 18 years--into the future. We want to know about the house they bought, the kids they had, the parties they've thrown, the clashes they've had with in-laws, etc. I've read wonderful books that got all the way to the end and had no epilogue and made me truly feel cheated. I think if writers knew how much a lack of an epilogue can kill a readers' experience (even if the rest of the book was a gem), they'd ALL write them. Hell, I think publishers should make them mandatory!

All in all, I enjoyed this book quite a bit if you haven't already discerned that; I can't wait to read more from this author. And while I didn't mind how short it was, the reason I gave it only 4 stars is because the length didn't allow for more robust character development. Had there been more time for that, I'm certain it would have earned that fifth star.
