She Speaks to Angels is most assuredly not what I expected. What I expected was a somewhat lighthearted, upbeat, young adult novel about a young girl who can speak to angels. What I found was a beautiful novel that, although it is quite dark in many spots, tells the story of a young girl who is torn between the powers of good and evil and trying to protect her heart and those she cares about. The characters are charming, and I found Ali and her friends easily relatable. I am quite eager to read the next novella in the series, *Dumah's Demons*, and the next full novel, *Falling Angels*, to see where the saga of Ali takes her. *She Speaks to Angels* is a novel that I believe will appeal to readers of all ages, and rightly so.

Ali Maney is a typical high school teenager. Nothing special ever happens to her. As a student at Millennium High in Manhattan, sure, a few weird things have happened, a few suicides over the years, but nothing really bizarre. Until one day, in English class, when a hugely popular football player, Tyler, suddenly pitches himself off the roof to his death. Ali and her two best friends, Molly and Jen, are positive that Tyler's death was not intentional. As they investigate, the bad boy in town starts to notice Ali. Daemon is gorgeous! Ali is shocked, but amazed. What could he want with her? As she ponders this, three new students arrive. Kian, Krysta, and Nathaniel all seem to have something.....different about them. Ali is floored when Kian appears more than interested in her too. What is she to do with two gorgeous guys after her? But not everything is as it seems. As Ali gets closer to each Daemon and Kian, the forces of the supernatural will come closer as well. One has been sent to protect, one has been sent to kill. Can Ali be saved? Or is she in way over her pretty little head?

Allison is seventeen, and being a teenager is never easy, but for Ali it is worse. In the past there have been kids that have committed suicide at her school. When a popular, beloved football player allegedly jumps off the roof of the high school, Ali has more questions than answers. Suddenly, three new students start at Ali's High School, she befriends them, and then she realizes they are troublemakers.

When Ali's crush, Dameon, starts to pay attention to her, Ali is thrilled, but torn between him and her three new friends. Not knowing whom to trust, Ali and her friends question the supposed suicide, and she learns there is more going on than what it appears.

This is a YA book and I highly enjoy this genre, but (there's that but again) I was not a typical high school kid, I guess, because some of the things, like always wanting to be kissed (and thinking about how attracted to someone she is - ok, we get it!!), the lack of concentration on important topics, the childish behavior between best friends, and love triangles are all completely alien to me. (I don't even remember my friends being that way and probably would have stopped being friends with them if this was the way they acted.) Talking this out with my mom, she says I can't hate the book because of that stuff - and I agree - but I can write in my review that I disliked all of that malarky. The rest of the story does make up for it, though. The adventure kept me reading and will keep me reading the rest of the series.

I do want to point out that, at the end of the book, she includes "Discussion Questions." I actually think that authors who write for this age group should utilize this tool to help with recalling what they read and she did a good job with them.

Questions to be answered. Ali starts to get to know the two boys and finds some things that are disturbing. Unknown to Ali, some forces beyond her control are also working either against her or for her. You'll have to read to find out.

We have a bad boy and we have a good boy. One is out to kill her and the other is out to save her. You may be surprised to find out which is which. I was. As we all know, nothing is as it seems, ever! Has Ali stepped beyond the safe line? Has she gone into a space that she can't get out of? The author wrote a thought provoking read that will keep you on your toes trying to answer questions and trying to decide who is evil and who is good. Is it possible one is an angel and one is a devil? Think hard on this one. I'm ready for book two.

Ami Blackwelder, indie author, brings a Young Adult paranormal tale of suspense, intrigue and a little love to Millennium High School. The first few pages of the book bring sadness as the class looks out the window as Tommy commits suicide. Imagine how horrified those kids are! Ali (Allison) convinces her friends that something's not right about it. So, they investigate and find just enough to bring more trouble to Ali's world. Blackwelder handles the situation without an overly dreadful air, yet it doesn't ignore the suspense and danger that's coming.

Dameon is tall, dark, and handsome, a combination Ali can't ignore. Suddenly he's paying attention to her and they become an item. Her friends become jealous since her attention is diverted from them, a very similar situation that occurs in high schools across the nation. But how does Dameon really feel? Does he love her like she hopes?

Three new students start at the school, but who are they? Ali's friends are spending time with them. Ali likes them too, but Kian tries to get in the way of her relationship with Dameon. Oh what a tangled web.

Ali's brother is a cop, investigating the suicide. He lives at home with Ali and their mom. He doesn't figure prominently, just enough to know their relationship is a typical brother-sister relationship and that he wants to keep her protected, as any older brother would, especially in a family without a dad.

As the paranormal reveals itself, the gang is taken into a world where anything can happen. Things we see today in our lives might, just might, be something else entirely. Read *She Speaks with Angels* to find out!

I was intrigued by the plot of this book at first, as I have a thing for books about angels and demons. I like to read different authors' take on the Paranormal theme, and this one seemed unique to me. I also like YA when written well, which sadly in this case, it was not. I will say that the story had a lot of potential and had tons of great ideas. For me, the problem was execution and style (which there was very little of).

For one thing, the main character Ali, and her friends, are probably the most insipid group of teens I've ever read about in a book. They are high school Juniors but act more like 4th graders. I found their verbal exchanges to be a bit on the corny side, and it felt as if the author was simply imitating what she thinks a teenager should sound like. Like some bad MTV movie or something. It was so stereotypical and full of unneeded slang that I found myself rolling my eyes on every other page. And I may be alone in this but the author's use of OMG grated on my nerves. I don't know a lot of people that say OMG out loud and have mostly seen it used in texts or online. Even if people do say it out loud, in this case it was way overused.

What was sad for me was that the author clearly has talent. There were pieces of brilliant writing that shone through and had lots of promise. But then it's like she went back and dumbed the whole thing down because it was geared toward teenagers and ruined it with the OMG's and other such stuff. It really wasn't needed. The fact that this book deals with issues like suicide and sex are enough to capture the young crowd. On the other end, all of the grownups in the book were equally corny. They sounded like a carbon copy of a bad TV mom. It was just not believable. I kept reading and thinking (who says this kind of stuff?)

Also, the story dragged on and on and was weighed down by the inane chatter of Ali and her two friends. Halfway through the book very little has been accomplished toward the solving of the mystery, but we have learned just how snotty Ali and her friends can be. When the three girls bully the new kids over a table at a coffee shop (a table that they always sit at so clearly it must be theirs), I just about threw my Kindle across the room. There was just too much of these sorts of interactions, that by the time I got to the good part (Kian and Daemon in an angel/demon fight), I was so worn out from the other mess that I didn't really want to continue. There are also a lot of inconsistencies. For instance Ali's brother's eye color changes from brown to blue halfway through the book. The school janitor's name switched from Alberto to Antonio. One night when the girls are inspecting clues from Tommy's locker (photos and drawings), they mysteriously disappear. How is it then, that the next night Ali pulls them out to look them over again? Hadn't they gone missing? It was things like this that made it hard to get into the story.

Overall, I felt this story could have been a solid 4 or 5 if not for poor execution. I hate to give such a bad review, but I try to be as honest as I can when writing these. I think that this book would go over well for very young teens (12-14), but anyone older than that might find it as insipid as I did.

My Thoughts: This was an unsolicited book that the author sent to me; I guess because I'd won a couple of her books from LibraryThing. My reactions to the previous books I'd read by this author were mixed, so I wasn't sure what to expect from this, other than it isn't really in my preferred genre. I was pleasantly surprised by how much I enjoyed the story. Despite a lot of really silly similes, the writing was pretty natural-sounding, and very much like what would come out of high school students. I also found the relationships and their progressions were pretty realistic based upon my own memories of the hormone-charged days of being a teenager.

Admittedly this is an ARC, so I can probably believe that the janitor, whose name changes from Alberto to Antonio, will have his name finalized in the end. However, after the girls took all the stuff out of Tommy's locker, that night it all disappeared; then Sunday night Ali gets up and looks at his drawings – which were among the items that disappeared on Wednesday night. This is probably a major plot point that will be hard to fix. Hopefully it is.

Overall I would recommend this book - I quite liked it despite the few problems, most of which I anticipate will be fixed by the final copy.
