She's hurt and traumatized but she pushes through, has an epic friendship with her bff Saskia and actually stands her ground and pushes toxic people out of her life when they refuse to help themselves. If this had been worked on more, she'd be in my top 10 heroines for sure.

I can't ship her with Jared at all, even with what happens at the end. Al throughout the story I felt like he was set up as a kind of villain protagonist, a psychopath who thinks he's doing good. He kills people, breaks people's hearts, manipulates and lies with barely a shrug. But with the thing at the end, I'm thinking this might be due to the really distanced narration- fail.
