Let me start off with I really enjoyed this book, I read it in a day! It was a fun fantastical read and I have never read this type of romance book before.

I discovered a new genre, Steampunk. What is Steampunk? Wish For Me was an ok read, a lot of the book is more of Glory's fascination with the new sexy genie and I would've preferred getting more into the action of the story a bit quicker. Glory spends a ton of time just admiring Irving which I could have done without hearing about his good looks quite so often. Also, I don't

know if it was Glory's infatuation or just the way her personality was coming across to me but she often seemed a lot younger than she is meant to be in the book.

Once the books gets more into the Djinn world we also start the relationship between Glory and Irving. I wasn't completely hooked on the sexier moments between the two just because of the feeling that Glory often seemed more of a young teen than her age. Wish for Me by A. Star is the first instalment in The Djinn Order series. It is an action-packed steampunk, adult, fantasy and romance novel.

The novel is narrated in the first person by Glory St. Pierre, who seems rebellious but is plain obnoxious. Glory stumbles on a strange looking vase which turns out is more of a genie or Djinn lamp. The contraption, nothing like the lamp Aladdin finds, houses the Djinn Irving Amir, who gives Glory the chance to make three wishes. The two characters start out their relationship on a sarcastic note but an arrow to Irving's shoulder quickly changes their relationship.

Although there is significant character development for Glory, the protagonist and narrator, I did not like her; I liked her sometimes but those instances were few. The first few chapters put me off the two characters but bit by bit I began to like Irving Amir and respect him.

Apart from the sweet-talk and "uber-sexy abs" and away from the early dislike of humans, Irving is overall an experienced, wise and loveable character, as opposed to Glory. \

"Humans are shallow creatures with shallow desires and they only ever wish for shallow things. Fame, infinite wealth, love from the one who would not love them otherwise... the story is always the same." This Irving's view of human in chapter one, but as the novel progresses, his view begins to change and begins to fall for Glory and she for him, although at first she is more attracted to him sexually than anything else. The sarcasm coming from both characters offers a bit of comic relief every now and then to ease the tension, which is a lot in the novel.

After Irving gets a poisoned arrow to his shoulder and Glory accidentally wishes for magic, things change drastically. Both become hunted by more than one side.

The ending of Wish for Me was much stronger than I anticipated. Not only that, many of the hunter-prey roles become reversed as Irving and Glory must team up with enemies to fight other enemies.

A. Star uses several Arabic words and names, which I thought was cute considering Arabic is my mother tongue.

I enjoyed the contraptions created by Irving. He likes to tinker and create. In his realm, everything is

mechanical – the steampunk element – and I enjoyed the description of many of his creations, especially Nagi.

One of the things that bothered me while reading, however, was the author's constant and repetitive use of "questioned". I mean there are options like "asked" and "said", and certainly others, but the excessive use of "questioned" irritated me beyond measure – it was worth a star or half a star in my rating.

Also, there were several major shifts, from tit-for-tat arguments to romance in a jiffy. I didn't like that and felt it disrupted the flow of the novel. It also felt awkward in places.

The adult content in *Wish for Me* is mainly because of the language and a couple of love scenes, which I didn't see as romantic or at least not what I was expecting with the author's bio (below). Still it is unsuitable for ages 18 and under.

I did enjoy the action in the novel and felt like I was in a movie.

A. Star uses several interesting and creative images such as "Irving still treated me like a pimple he was itching to pop."

Several revelations come at the end of the novel, paving the way of the second instalment in the series, which I would like to read if I get the chance.

Full Review:

I received a free ecopy of this book via Netgalley in exchange for an honest review.

When I started the book, my initial thoughts were, *ok, it's not quite my type of book, but it's enjoyable enough that I'm willing to overlook the tropes I don't like and accept the story.* But then, as the story progressed, it became more and more *romance-y*. It's not that I don't like romance in the books I read, it's just that I've had a hard time with paranormal romance lately because I'm not a fan of the instalove, the constant descriptions of how sexy the man is, and the alpha males---all the things that seem to so often define the genre, and all of which this book had. (Maybe it wasn't *technically* instalove, but she wanted him from the

moment she saw him, even though he was a strange man she thought had broken into her bedroom, and it only took about two times of hanging out before they were swearing on their lives to protect each other.)

I'm not saying the book was bad though. Those things are, as I said, pretty par for the course with light paranormal romance, so it's just a matter of preference. The book also had a unique mash-up of djinn and steampunk, plus a type of female lead you don't see very often, what with her pixie cut, tattoos, and rocker style.

I do have one major complaint though. It is NEVER ok with me when the man in a book ties up/handcuffs the woman in bed without her permission and without any discussion of safe words and then refuses to let her out even when she asks. It doesn't matter to me if that's what she secretly wanted. I've seen it in books before, and it always instantly kills the scene for me and makes me dislike the male character. I do recognize that books are not real life, and other adults can make their own decisions about what they like to read, but it bothers *me* too much to not mention it.

That ending was also kind of a cliffhanger, and I'm not sure what exactly the goal was or whether it was resolved, but the author does throw in some twists and at least gives you some answers instead of leaving you completely hanging at the end of the book.

So again, not for me, but possibly enjoyable for readers with different taste than mine.

I think I had read two books about Djinn before but it wasn't until this book that I felt like yeah, I need to read more books with them (or author's need to write more with them). I was pretty sure I was going to like this book but I hadn't expected to love it this much from start to ending. Just... amazing!

This story is about Glory St. Pierre who chances upon what she thinks is a vase in the basement of her grandmother who has passed away. Glory was such a fun character to read about. I truly enjoyed reading about everything she did and when Irving, a Djinn, was thrown into the mix it just kept getting better. Glory and Irvine were stellar characters, casting the other characters in shadow, which was a bit of a shame. Their chemistry was sizzling, with tantalising banter ('LOL' is appropriate here) and a rather seductive power struggle in and out of the bedroom. Glory was so kickass, and I loved that she didn't fall into the same traps as other heroines. For example, when Irvine grabbed her arm to stop her from walking away (why is there always grabbing???), she CALLED HIM ON IT. I was so freaking proud of her. I wanted her for a friend – seriously.

I read almost non-stop, as the book was both relatively short and very absorbing. Star's writing is *super* easy to read, and you'll be done with the story and onto the next one in no time. She's very sarcastic, so basically my kind of lady. You can get a sense for her humour from the warning in the synopsis. (That warning is basically the reason I read the book, FYI.)

I'm not an expert in steampunk, but I actually enjoyed the steampunk elements in this story. They didn't feel forced, but instead added to the allure of the Djinn world. I would have liked to see more of the world built up, as it seemed superficial at times, and I want more interaction with Irvine's creations! (The bat is adorbs.)

I only have two reservations with the book:

1. The secondary characters didn't have a chance to fully develop, resulting in confusing and unbelievable behaviour.
2. The ending was very sudden and rushed, and it left my head spinning, but not in a good way.

Wish For Me sparked a little curiosity in me with the whole genie in a lamp and three wishes. I assumed it would be sort of like Aladdin but I had no idea I was going to like it this much. It's not the kind of book I would normally pick out, but once in a while I like to shake things up and deviate from my preferred genres. 3.5 stars — I had a few problems with this book, but it really was a fun read! I had never read a book about Djinnns before, and it surely was a lot of fun and a breath of fresh air! I was absolutely captivated by all the Djinn world and the magical atmosphere (kinda Aladdin's style), but unfortunately I wasn't as into the characters.

I've really nothing against Irving, I found him even funny in some parts, and there were a few jokes of Glory's that made me laugh, together with her sarcasm. I totally support strong female characters, usually, but despite this there were really a lot of times where I couldn't actually stand her! If there's a thing I hate is reading all over again a girl drooling over a man's physical appearance, even after the tenth time she sees him! Like, I understand he is described as a dreamy, sexy guy, but it sounds a bit repetitive to hear how gorgeous he is every few pages.

The other thing I had a problem with, was the relationship between the two. I would have preferred the book to have 100 more pages, but a more well developed relationship. I read this book in one afternoon and that's because it's irresistible. I find novels about Djinn mystical and special in a way I can't seem to describe, so I can never resist them, and Wish for Me is one of my new favorites!

The world the authors lead us into is magical and full of surprises. There are literally more than one moment when I thought about how I did not see that happen! It was amazing!

Glorie is a normal girl forced by coincidence into the world full of unexpected creatures, a war between races and into the reality of a problematic family she didn't even know she was a part of.

After Glory St Pierre takes possession of an odd vase with mechanical gears, she lands herself with an unexpected slave – a genie. Irving Amir hates being called a genie – he's a djinn – and he's none too fond of the human race either, letting no time pass before he makes Glory aware of this fact.

Well Glory can give as good as she gets, and although her djinn is hotter-than-hot sex-on-legs, she isn't about to let him treat her like a piece of dirt.

So starts a fiery relationship, with layers of secrets that pop out at unexpected turns, keeping this story twisting and turning and always entertaining. The dialogue is snarky and fun, the action fast, and the

characters have a depth and realism that draws you in and pulls you along.

I did have a few niggles: when Irving takes Glory back home to the kingdom of Shrinelyn, the descriptions seem to be straight out of the Arabian Nights – I'd have liked a little innovation. Admittedly once they venture into the countryside it's there, in the amazing fun Steampunk thread that winds through the tale, but for me, the palace was a tad predictable, and the sex came over a bit like a nod to Fifty Shades. I was also not overly comfortable with Glory's lack of any reaction to a society chock full of servants who seem to be treated as no more than slaves.

And why on earth did Irving arm her with a sabre that she can't use, when his armoury is full of weapons she could just point and fire?

Those points aside, I really enjoyed this – until I reached the end.

Gahhhh!!! Yet another of those INFURIATING cliff hanger endings!

I thought I was safe as this is novella, or at best, short novel length. I did not expect to find it only a part of a longer story. I might read the next, because I really liked the characters and the unusual plot, but then again, I might not, because I find this type of ending to be such a turn off.

To be fair to the author, and the fact that there do seem to be readers out there who don't mind this type of episodic instalment, I've rated the book without taking this into account. But if, like me, you find cliff hangers to be extremely annoying, then beware.
