Every now and then, a series pops into my life and leaves me wrecked. Soulmated is such a fantastic series. The first book, Soulmated left me in need for book 2 immediately. Alas, I had to wait AN ENTIRE YEAR before Fighting Fate arrived in my email. Just like in Soulmated, I am left with this high from the unique and original story line, and now I am dropping, and the crash is going to hurt knowing I have to wait another year to read book 3.

In Fighting Fate, we pick up where Soulmated left off. The joining that did not quite happen because of Liam's fear of injuring Lucky, which resulted in Liam breaking up with her while he tried to figure out how to join without killing her, and left them both catastrophically wrecked for weeks. Their waves of emotions were so savage they barely slept, they could not breathe while away from each other, Lucky lost weight because she could not eat. As a reader, you feel their pain. You have been there, you have experienced that loss at some point in your life that leaves a hole in your soul that you cannot figure out how to fill back in. In some cases, we get better, use some duct tape to close the wound, and move forward with our lives. In other cases, the hole gets bigger, and consumes us more until we can no longer breathe. We have to decide if we will drown, or find that strength to keep fighting the waves before they take you under. This is what Liam and Lucky had to decide. Review:

Fighting Fate finds Liam determined to protect his soulmate ‘Lucky’ at all costs, which leads to the event of him breaking up with her for her own safety. Heartbroken and aimless, Lucky finds herself falling into the hold of her mom’s mysterious new boss, who seems to have all the answers for her predicament. Lucky’s offered the ultimatum: stay and abide to her mother’s plans for her life, or leave with the new stranger who promises her a world anew?

The second book very quickly picks up where the first book left off and it does well to get the story going quickly again. This is nice for the audience because, especially if they’ve been waiting on the continuation of the series for quite some time, they’re going to be reunited with the characters that they’ve already come to

know rather well. Likewise, just like the continuation of the story does well to maintain the narrative and the plot itself, the author yet again returns with the wonderful characterisations of the cast members that are showcased throughout. For the readers who have come to know and love Lucky and Liam, they're going to be thrilled to know that their personalities shine through even brighter in this continuation of the series. Liam's notable dialect and his bold personality are just as evident as before and, whilst that's captivating for the reader directly, I think the main light shines on Lucky's development throughout the book.

Focusing on this element of the book further, I do think that Lucky's character arc is something that needs to be considered and explored further. At times I felt as if her strength was 'ebbing and flowing', if it were. It felt as if she was developing but in a way where she took one step forward and two steps back. In a sense, it felt as if it were a game of cat and mouse – will she, won't she? This is definitely something that has the potential to be developed in the further continuation of the series and the third book as, since she's obviously such a main focus of the narrative, her character needs to become more sturdy and further needs to be 'scoped out'. However, this also links into the fact that Lucky showcases her own issues with coming to terms with her personality within this second novel, as her ties to Liam's world become more developed and further details are revealed as the plot continues. She's facing an internal battle and doesn't know who she really is – and this is an element of her characterisation that comes across easily to the audience themselves. Though, this is also something that I didn't feel all that comfortable within as a plot feature itself. As somebody who has a mental illness that legitimately causes them to lose all sense of identity, a part of me felt that it was being used a 'shock' tactic. It was all reacted to in a very dramatic fashion by the characters as if it were completely unrealistic and unthought of when this isn't the case. A part of me could indeed relate to Lucky's struggle in terms of her not being able to pinpoint who she was, but this only lasted for a moment before the story moved on and seemed to completely forget that plot point in its entirety. I was happy that the book wasn't focusing on the fact and inadvertently using the mental illness as a shock factor, but I do think that it was introduced to play a bigger role in the story than it actually was. Again, this is a personal thing as I'm directly linked to the subject matter at hand and I'm sure that a lot of readers will just skim over it as another plot point, but it is something that I picked up on through my own reading experience.

Back to the main plot content of the second book, I definitely enjoyed the fact that there seemed to be a lot more action that was present throughout. Even though the first book does well to completely immerse the readers, the second book works to keep them entertained as the action makes the plot feel more 'fast-paced'. Despite this, the novel has been written wonderfully in the way that it allows the audience to follow the action even as it picks up. This means that the reader isn't going to get sidetracked and they're not going to lose focus of the main things that are happening in the plot at that point in time. Not only does this, again, make them feel closer to the story, but it makes them feel as if they're part of the narrative, more so than just spectators who are looking in. Due to this, the second book proves to be another easy read as it continuously flows well and at no point did I feel as if the content or the action was lagging. The pacing of the second book is just as good as it was in the first which the reader base is generally going to appreciate as it makes it more enjoyable to read. It also works to tie the two books together a lot better and the plot between the two seems to flow. There's no 'jump' between the first book and the second which leaves the readers feeling as if they've missed out on something – they don't have questions that are still unanswered.

The characters are faced with new challenges that test their relationship to both each other and their family members around them, so it's obvious that there's going to be a lot of emotional conflicts. One of the things that I liked about the book – and that I generally enjoy when it comes to the series itself – is the fact that the author does so well to showcase and portray the emotions that the characters are experiencing. In turn, the audience gets a better understanding of what they're going to and they're able to put themselves in the mindset of the characters that they've come to be so close to. Even just through describing what the characters are experiencing, the author does well to create visualisation that transports the audience into the

world of the story and they feel as if they're going through the plot with the characters directly.

Again, I think it's just personal preference in the fact that I'm not versed in the romance genre which is why there are elements of the book that still made me cringe. I can't relate to any of the relationship experiences or the emotions that are showcased, and so, in turn, I don't think I understand the extent of them. In some scenes, instead of seeming romantic, the actions of the characters just seemed dramatic and over-the-top. I'm not a huge fan of romance and this series definitely didn't convert me, but that doesn't mean that it was any less of a joy to read and experience. It's always fun to expand reading preferences and explore different stories and plots, this one just happened to be further from my personal life.

I think the end of the book does well to round off this specific 'chapter' of the story but, at the same time, it effectively leaves it open to continuation. It doesn't leave the reader thinking 'what if' like the first book did, but it does indicate that the story is going to expand even further and that the characters are going to face more challenging situations that they're going to have to battle through. For fans of the series, this is going to leave them on the end of their seats and, for new readers, they're likely to want to explore the plot even further as well. We know what's going to happen, but we don't know how and we don't know how the characters are going to deal with the obstacles that are thrown into their paths, so that gives the audience enough motivation to mark the upcoming third book down on their 'to be read' list.

To put it simply; this second book in the continuation of the series does well to reunite the readers with the characters that they know and love. The characterisation is excellently written, once again, and the relationships that form throughout the progression of the book really shine through. Though there are a lot of elements of the book that could be improved (such as either expanding on or closing off the whole 'conformer' storyline), the narrative has still been well-constructed and does a great job of submerging the audience into the world of Lucky and Liam yet again. Likewise, the book showcases a lot of potential for the characters to be developed in the future, which holds the audience's attention even further and prompts them to want more. It's another fun, immersive, riveting read that transports the reader into a world that's completely new. All in all, there's definitely going to be a fanbase waiting for these two to make their return in the third

"Who was the *real* Lucky?"

Shaila Patel did it again! The characters were captivating, the connections between Liam and Lucky were descriptive, and my heart was beating out of my chest with ANOTHER cliffhanger! Why do you do this to me, Shaila?

One thing I particularly loved about this second book is the more in depth looks into Liam and Lucky's individual cultures, as well as that of the empaths. The descriptions of the landscape of Ireland and the foods of Lucky's Indian heritage created a desire to know more, to understand more. I even went and made myself some *penda* after reading the mouth-watering descriptions! There is also a bunch more background on the empath history, which sometimes slowed the plot down quite a bit, but it all ties up very nicely by the end of the book.

As Lucky learns more about what it means to be an empath, her powers and connection with Liam, and the dangers racing toward her, it honestly gave me some Twilight vibes. Let me preface this by saying I do NOT like the Twilight books, I DO like the Joining of Souls books. For starters, I think Patel writes these stories better than Meyers did. But the phenomenon of Lucky turning into this supernatural being and Liam teaching her about this world and her powers made me feel a ton of similarities between the stories. Thankfully, while Liam and Lucky can get pretty obsessive about each other, neither are whiney and selfish like Bella and Edward. In fact, one thing I admire a ton about their love for each other is how much they seek to put the other person before themselves, trying to give them what's best for them. But, like typical teenagers, that's not *always* actually the best thing for them.

There is still the tension of Lucky's mom's desires and Lucky being straddled between Indian culture, American culture, and empath culture, which is one of the most interesting conflicts in these books in my opinion. How does Lucky stand up to her mom without dishonoring her? How can she be one person split between so many people and worlds?

Patel does a fantastic job of jumping in right where Book 1 ended, while also slowly reminding you of things from the first book without being completely obnoxious. Yes, that's a thing. I remember hating it way back when I was a kid reading the Nancy Drew books as a kid. YES I KNOW WHO NANCY IS BY THIS POINT, OKAY? The last fourth of the book had my heart racing. I was reading as fast as I can, devouring the drama. Unfortunately, as I mentioned earlier, Shaila LOVES her cliffhangers, so now I have to wait even MORE impatiently for the next book!

This is the second book in this breathless YA romance telling the tale of Irish Empath Prince Liam who is living in the U.S. to find his dream-foretold soulmate: who just happens to be an Indian-American name Laxshmi.

Love, love, love the set up and all the cultural living-in-America-but-of-Asian-background stuff that goes into this. Laxshmi, or Lucky, as Liam calls her, has to deal with cultural assumptions by her mother about how she should behave, can't be seen with her white boyfriend at Diwali celebrations, and struggles with her identity. Cool stuff.

Wasn't as enamored of the Irish brogue speech patterns Liam, his parents, and mysterious Empath Elder Brennan had. (and that sometimes bled over into other characters). It wore on me. That's most likely personal taste, however.

I also felt that I probably should have started this series with the first book. Liam and Lucky , while not together at the start of the book, are quite deeply connected to each other. And I mean deeply. They are massively in luuuvvve and very vocal about that to each other in terms of saying things like "you are my soul" etc. This felt a bit over the top at times, and I was thinking that if I had been along for the ride as they fell in love and found each other, it might not have felt so overwhelming.

The story is heavy on feelings, and protecting each other, and figuring out what they're going to do with their lives now that they've found each other but haven't quite joined in soulmating (or in a more physical sense, if you get my drift, this is very sweet romance with one joke about "diddies" when she's in the hospital but other wise just a lot of holding and kissing so safe for most ranges of YA). It's a little less heavy in plot. Although we get some intrigue with another Empath Elder out to use Lucky for his own nefarious purposes, and a forced arranged marriage, it's mostly Lucky and Liam feeling each other's feelz as Empaths (lots of water and air imagery describing their feelings.)

If you're a lover of YA fiction with characters that are emotional spigots of angst and love, this book will be

right up your alley. And despite my quibbles with Liam's brogue, as a character, he's great (and a hottie). And if you're looking for a main character who lives in her bicultural identity as an Asian-American, definitely pick up this book. As a parent of bicultural daughters, I really did enjoy that part of the book.
