Another tasty collection of bad dreams for our Baku. Out of all the episodic ‘horror’ manga there is on offer, I have only liked a handful and seeing as I’m up to volume 8 of this, you can draw the conclusion this is one of them (*Ghost Hunt* is the other). I like this one because Hiruko, Hifumi and Misako are more than framework for the horror as in so many others.

The dreams included in this one include one about childhood friendship that was really more about a bully and his victim who’s finally tired of it. Kairi, the owner of the fantasy-maker club Delirium, gets trapped in his own club and Hifumi and Hiruko go to help him. Perhaps the most interesting of the dreams is the one where the dreamer is setting up traps to capture Baku putting Hiruko and his rival, Tsukishiro, at risk. Hifumi plays two central roles in a couple dreams, a serious one about his friend’s inn which leaves Hiruko injured and the absolutely silly one where Hifumi finds himself in an arranged married to Shigoroku, a cross-dressing wealthy daughter who is pretty much Hifumi was a woman. The next volume also sounds too interesting to wait long to buy it.

I liked this volume the least out of the series so far, though there was still some enjoyment to be had. The episodic cases, as always, are hit or miss. I loved the trap set for a Baku, while it was a bit kaleidoscopic on the eyes, Kairi being caught in his own fantasies was good too, and the sea of drowned memories provided some good chills and twists too.

The downsides came with the other tales. The inn with deadly secrets was bizarre - just not my cup of tea, while the man in the elevator and the mother’s forgotten item were merely so-so (mostly for their convoluted premises). What sort of left a bad taste in my mouth was Hifumi’s family affairs, which were just utterly ridiculous and entirely unfunny.

Glad the other stories balanced everything out, otherwise I'd have been disappointed in this penultimate volume.

As we close in on the end of the "Nightmare Inspector" manga series, I am still impressed at how every volume never fails to send a shiver down my spine. Volume 8 is no exception. In this book we see the consequences of a friendship turning nasty, as well as learn more about the vital role that Delirium's master plays, when he gets caught-up in his own fantasies, Hiruko and Hyfumi must rescue him, for the sake of reality, along with learning that split-personality problems in a dream have deadly consequences in the real world and one dreamer learns the hard way the perils of trying to trap a baku.

The series is winding down. The characters' past and present are on a collision course. And yet they managed to get a few more solo stories in here.

Most of them are okay, but nothing special. However, we do get a couple that are really worth flagging. First Kairi gets stuck in a room at the Delerium and Hiruko and Hifumi have to go in and pull him out. It's mostly just weird, but for something that gets uncovered but not explored at the end. Then we see Tsukishiro looking into someone's dream in exchange for information.

That's followed by an unimportant arc where Hifumi brings Hiruko to an inn owned by his friend to try and help him with an issue. It's pretty rare to see an absolutely serious side of Hifumi, so I enjoyed this (especially since he goes completely off the deep end with the final chapter of this book).

Coming up, for better or for worse - the final issue and everything that comes with it.
