Unfortunately when you are a former child star who is famous for some not so wonderful publicity the chances of quietly being in your best friend's wedding are slim. Matthew is the brother who always felt he had to earn his way into the Beaumont family, and he did it by keeping the family image in good standing. Whitney coming to the ranch is a dream come true and a nightmare at the same time.

I had strong protective feelings for Whitney from the moment I met her on the page. I like how she changed her life into something she was comfortable living each day. She was a very caring person, you could see that in how she talked about her animals and dealt with the horrid fans. She was written with lots of emotion because I ached for her to find love. Matthew was a character that intrigued me from the first book in the series. However in this book he rather grated on my nerves the first few chapters. He is very concerned with his place in the family and I had doubts that he and Whitney would be a good fit. You could feel their attraction leaping off the page.

The plot was easy to follow as it was the days leading up to the wedding. I will say I got kind of lost on how many days before the wedding Whitney came to the ranch, it seemed like she came weeks before instead of just days. The conflict that challenged Whitney and Matthew should have been one Matthew saw coming (my goodness Whitney did!) and prepared a plan to avoid it.

This is a holiday book, my goodness Christmas is even in the title, but Christmas takes a back seat. This is a wonderful heartwarming story, but if you want a book that flaunts Christmas and has many scenes of wonderful Christmas memories to get you in the Christmas spirit – go find a different book after you read this one.

This is not my first Sarah M. Anderson book, I have read many, and it won't be my last. The conclusion of this book while satisfying has created questions in my mind as to what is in Whitney and Matthew's future. I am hoping there is another Beaumont family book in my future so I can check in on them.

I read this one on a whim. I like the bad girl with a stuffy hero trope, but this didn't work for me.

First of all, this was third in a series and there were a slew of supporting characters I didn't care about.

Second, the entire story took place in two weeks and those two weeks were devoted entirely to wedding preparations. There were endless details about hairstyles, shoes and dress fittings.

It was the hero who cared about the hairstyles, shoes and dress fittings because he is the third brother of the infamous Beaumont family and he is determined to pull off the PR coup of the year with an elegant society wedding to rehab his older half brother who has been in rehab. He is supposedly a control freak. (I said supposedly because he acted like a glorified wedding planner - never barking out orders but deferentially reminding everyone of the schedule. Not an alpha)

So third, this hero is not very interesting to me. The heroine - the bad girl - hasn't been bad for ten years. She is a former child actress who is now a horse trainer/breeder who tells boring stories about her pets while showing their pictures on her phone. (I'm not kidding - two pages about her rescue dogs we never meet in the flesh)

And - nothing. The child star and the third brother hook up. They have tied-up sex to show the hero's controlling nature(?) and the she ties him up later on so we know he really loves her to give up his control. (?)

Matthew Beaumont always felt like an outsider in the Beaumont family. He is the one who smooths over the disagreements within the family, and he is the one who handles the media for the public screw-ups by this prominent family. He sees public redemption for the family name in his brother Philip's wedding to horse trainer Jo Speers.

Whitney Maddox has agreed to be the maid of honor at her friend Jo's wedding. But Jo is marrying Philip Beaumont, of the prominent Beaumont family, and the wedding is being engineered as the social event of the year by Matthew Beaumont, the public relations whiz of the Beaumont family. Matthew's hopes for a perfect event are dashed when he realizes that Whitney isn't just a horse breeder from California. She is Whitney Wildz, former wild child actress, public relations nightmare, and object of his adolescent desire.

This is an enjoyable romance between two people who have tried to reinvent themselves to escape their painful pasts.

Although this was the third book in the series, it easily stands on its own without having to read the previous books.

Anderson's first two category novels were fantastic ... this latest effort, and I haven't read her since, was uneven. There were things I loved about it and others not: the heroine, Whitney Maddox, former wild child now quiet California horse-breeder, was sympathetic. She'd worked so hard to redeem her past and now, finally, has left her self-imposed hermitage, beautiful as it is, to attend her best friend's wedding. There she meets and is attracted to Matthew Beaumont, the Beaumont brother with the biggest chip on his shoulder because he craves Beaumont acceptance (he was illegitimate, a most old-fashioned premise). He's rigid and controlling over the wedding, his brother's, PR and as a result, is less than gentlemanly towards the maid-of-honour, Whitney. Good book, with two people who are trying to escape their pasts. Matthew has been the cleanup man for the Beaumont family for years. When someone in the family does something that creates bad publicity it is Matthew's job to fix it. He is determined that his brother Phillip's wedding (Tempted by a Cowboy) will go smoothly and provide some good publicity for the family. He's not at all happy to discover that the maid of honor is a former child star with a notorious past.

I really liked both Matthew and Whitney though Matthew was something of a jerk at the beginning. Matthew has always felt like a bit of an outsider in the Beaumont family. His father hadn't married his mother until Matthew was five years old, and as one of the illegitimate kids he feels like he has to earn his place. When he first finds out that Whitney is the maid of honor he is incredibly rude to her and about her. All he can see is her past troubles and the effect it could have on his quest for perfection. Much to his dismay he is also very attracted to her.

Whitney has worked hard for the past decade to overcome her past. She now has an excellent reputation as a horse breeder and avoids the limelight. She really wants to support her friend as her maid of honor, but is

very worried about what could happen when she's recognized. She's certain of it when Matthew really goes off on her. She's hurt by his reaction, especially since she was attracted to him and had hoped for a pleasant holiday flirtation. I ached for her when everybody kept expecting her to be like the old Whitney.

I loved seeing Matthew have to eat his words as he got to know the real Whitney. First he got very protective as he saw the way that she was harassed. Then he actually started to care for her, something that he never suspected would happen. Whitney also fell for Matthew, but never expected anything to come of it. She considered her past as too big a deterrent for any kind of long term relationship between them.

Both Matthew and Whitney spent a lot of time worrying about what other people thought of them.
