I enjoyed this amusing story about a duck who gets stuck in some mud and requires some help from his friends to get on his way again safely. I thought that it had a teachable 'moral' about being kind towards people who need help, and I really liked the way that the illustrations were laid out on each page. However, I read this book for the first time today in a Nursery setting and the children really enjoyed it, so I have to say, my review/rating is more based on that evidence than my personal response. Even at three years of age the children recognised and followed the rhyme and by the end, even began to anticipate the text. Whilst the text could be adapted for older children to emphasise the use of rhyme, at the simplest level it was a real joy to participate in reading the story aloud together with the youngest readers.

We all love the attitude that we give to duck as he informs an impatient sheep that he cannot get out of the way because his truck is stuck...my 18 month old especially loves the "slurp and squelch and suck as the sheep steps slowly through the muck".

I highly recommend this book to all--its cute, funny, rhymey (which I get that some people aren't into...why I don't know....)

I read a review by someone else who thought that the duck's behavior in the end of the book was harsh, but I

think that its just ducks personality....he is very self involved....anyhow, it gives the opportunity for a discussion about being gracious, thankful, helpful, etc....good friends/bad friends....the world ain't perfect yo! *if I'm not mistaken, the board book version doesn't omit anything, it just condenses the story onto fewer pages(by squishing three pages onto one, think comic book style)...its been a while since I've seen the paper page version though...I'll have to check on that...

Sue Winson says

I wasn't too sure about this book when I first read it. There were too many undesirable characters in the book: the sheep was rude and unhelpful, the duck was ungrateful and obnoxious. But 23-month old Little-AJ loves it and requested this to be read and re-read too many times. I think I can finally understand the addictiveness of this book and discover its charm after the numerous reading sessions with little-AJ.

A very simple storyline: the duck'a truck was stuck in the muck. A frog, a sheep and a goat came to help.

This book uses really simple texts ("this is the duck driving home in a truck. This is the track..."). Toddlers follow the texts and storyline easily, with clear pictures illustrating each of those lines. The duck's behavior is not an exemplary kind, and neither is the very rude sheep. But the frog is kind, and the goat is smart and helpful. So that makes great comparison and gives us a chance to talk about different characters and personalities of people.

(Spoiler ahead) The ending either makes you frown or laugh. The truck was finally back in its track, and the duck drove off happily, leaving the 3 helpers (sheep, goat and frog) stuck in the muck! I frowned the first time, but nowadays I just laughed with little-AJ, and ended with a "what a horrible duck" remark. Little-AJ giggled louder after hearing this.

I love this book (not a love at first sight, but this book has become an addiction).
