I was prepared to not like this book. It looked and sounded "frilly", but my friend recommended it and said it's a good light read. I had just read a couple of heavy books so I dove in.

More de-LIGHT-ful than light, I enjoyed it very much. Thayer is a good writer, and I intend to read more from her. This book was written ten years ago and there are references that date it--for example, when all the women pull out their calendars to write something down. But for the most part it's current and fun.

Thayer's group of women "of a certain age" call themselves the Hot Flash Club and they've bonded together and meet regularly mostly to discuss things that would bore their husbands/sig. others including dating after 60, weight and health challenges, family relationships.

This book also has a few younger women who meet each other in the hot tub at the spa and form friendships. Their issues are typical of the more youthful age--pregnancy, step-motherhood, mothers-in-law, schooling and employment. But Thayer has a wry sense of humor and keeps the writing lively.

She also has a large list of characters to keep track of, but their individual "stories" help keep them all in perspective.

A couple of character's stories didn't have satisfactory endings. I wanted to know more about how Beth and her future mother-in-law worked things out, and how did Claudia's will and estate end up? Was there anything that Polly found that she would treasure? Did her mother-in-law soften at all towards her in the end?
