There is just something about a second chance romance that hits me right in the feels. It's hope at its best. It's about forgiveness, personal growth and most importantly it's about knowing what your heart wants most of all – and going for it, no matter what. With Every Breath was not overly emotional or deep – but it did hit the right buttons when it comes to romance.
