While I had initially been expecting a collection of anecdotes, I instead found the text to be a whimsical-type gift book with short excerpts on the left-facing pages, complimenting hand-drawn illustrations on the right-facing pages.

Personally, I enjoyed the playful drawings and occasional symbolism and detail incorporated within illustrations on the patterns of the people's clothing. My favorite example of this was on page 48, where the woman has a tables and chairs pattern on her blouse while the man holds a cat tucked into the pocket of his sweater.
