I get frustrated when reading books with so much potential and fails to impress me when it counts. This is one such book.

At first, it takes place on the sea, with Patrick O'Shea, the half-Indian captain of the Indian Rose. He gets tossed around at sea and sent to the "present day", 2008, where he meets our heroine, Jessica Hart. Recently losing both her parents, one at sea and other by sickness, Jessi is alone and afraid to live again. Patrick mistakes Jessi as a boy, until, non-creepily, he finds out that she's female.
