Unfortunately this was a **DNF** for me. There were a lot of things that didn’t work. First, the beginning of the book. Sure, there’s this warning from the author and I can say I’ve already read a lot of “dark” stuff in books. But this was just too much. And I feel the need to warn here myself, too – BE AWARE, there’s a very violent and disturbing rape-scene at the beginning of the book, in which the female MC is violated physically and mentally BADLY.

Then there was the writing. R. C. Stepehns seemed to not be very keen on punctuation marks. There was one sentence I had to read a few times, until the sense sank in:

“He sat on the long chair with his legs in front of him fully erect.”

Um, ok? Without a comma, this sentence says that his legs are fully erect. And there were quite a few things that really sat wrong with me in regard of grammar (switches in present and past tense) and typos.

And last but not least – the insta-attraction. Sometimes it works, other times not so much. This book is a great example for the author dictating us readers what to feel/think of the MC’s relationship. I want to FEEL my books, FEEL how the MC’s fall in love, struggle, the good moments and the bad! But sadly, I felt nothing in “Wild Cards”. I had zero connection to the characters, their stories or their relationship.
