Bamboozled by David Legge is a post modern picture book about a young girl who visited her grandfather for the weekend. Something about this visit though seems different to her. The pictures show the house as a trick house, but in the end the girl says it's because the grandfather is wearing mismatching socks.

The illustration and the text are very different which makes the drawing very important to the story. On one page, the text says that the girl is planting bulbs in the garden, but it does not mention that she is planting light bulbs instead of flower bulbs. Other silly draws are also featured in the illustrations. For example one page there is a kangaroo and an elephant doing the dishes and on another a painting stealing a drink from the table. Such details in the illustrations would keep a child entertained for many reads.

The way that the text and illustrations interact adds a humorous element. The text focuses on the little girl trying to figure out what is different about this visit to grandfather's. The reader can clearly see that this is not a normal house, but the girl and her grandfather don't bat an eye towards it. They act as if it is as normal as anything. Kids can find humor in this because to them everything is different, but the narrator doesn't notice it.
