The first book in the projected The Matchmakers of Huckleberry Hill series, Huckleberry Hill introduces the players in the story as Jennifer paints a sweeping canvass of the characters as she only can. As a result of her painstaking efforts, one is able to easily identify or relate with the characters and the unfolding story. Readers who read this book will not want to miss the next installment, Huckleberry Summer, and the third one, Huckleberry Christmas.

Lia Shetler is not your average next-door-girl. Age is fast catching up with her, and she is fast heading toward the wrong side of a marriageable age. Carrying a scar from a burn, she is tall and her parents have already resigned her to being a spinster. But Lia is kind, good-hearted and embodies all the virtues an Amish girl should possess. She has a heart of gold. Her younger sister Rachel is beautiful, spoiled and the family is on the lookout for a suitable husband.

On the other side of the story is Anna Helmuth, affectionately called Mammi, and Felty Helmuth, also known as Dawdi, who together have raised thirteen children over the course of their journey of over eighty years. They are both God-fearing and deeply cares for their family. Anna is worried about the personal life of her grandson Moses Zimmerman, who she finds is miserable. And she is determined to find him a wife. But Moses is equally determined to wait for his fiance Barbara, who left him and the Amish community three years ago. He's loyal and believes that she will return and marry him someday. But Anna wants Moses to find a new love, and his lost happiness again.

Believing that it is designed for them to scheme for the good of Moses, Anna sets her sight on Lia and arranges with Lia's father for Lia to spend the summer with their family on Huckleberry Hill in Bonduel, Wisconsin. Lia is invited to help out around the Helmuth's home. Despite the attraction he instantly feels for Lia, Moses is a hard nut to crack, and refuses to open his heart to Lia. As for Lia, though she has no inkling of an idea of the arrangement made between his father and Anna, she is surprised at herself for instantly liking the handsome and courteous Moses.

Moses and Lia become fast friends and enjoy their time together. Lia is also finally at peace with herself, and her time at Huckleberry Hill proves to be a good escape from her harsh and cruel father, distant and uncaring mother, and self-centered sister Rachel. But will her dysfunctional family leave her alone? Prodded by her father, Rachel spends much time conniving and planning to steal Moses from Lia. Though not wielding deathly weapons and blazing sound of guns may not be heard, Rachel and her parents make the perfect villain in the book.

He has agreed to wait six months for her to make up her mind if she would return to the Amish community or stay in the Englisher world. 80 year old grandparents Anna and Felty are done raising their 13 children and feel a little matchmaking help is needed for their grandson, Moses. Anna Helmuth is an elderly Amish woman with a penchant for matchmaking. She tells her patient husband, Felty, that they need to do something to help their poor grandson, Moses, to find a wife. So Anna decides that she needs an assistant – after all, she's getting too old to do all the housework, and she has heard good things about Lia Shelter.

Lia is twenty four years old, too tall, and has a scarred hand. In her parents' eyes, that makes her unmarriageable. Never mind that she can make the best pies in the whole Amish community, she works hard, and she is gentle, kind, and unselfish. Her parents have assigned her the unpleasant job of caring for her beautiful but spoiled and obnoxious younger sister, Rachel, and they won't even consider Lia's dreams to become a midwife. Lia feels trapped and downtrodden. But when her parents send her to Huckleberry Hill in Bonduel, Wisconsin, to assist Anna Helmuth, Lia's life changes dramatically. Suddenly she is appreciated for all her hard work, and she has the opportunity to study and become a midwife. And that good-looking grandson of theirs makes her pulse race.

Moses Zimmerman's fiancé left him and the Amish church for the big city life, but she still keeps her claws hooked deep with weekly letters and promises that someday she's coming back. Moses is twenty-four, heartbroken, and he knows he needs to make a fresh start. When he goes up to help his grandfather, Felty, on their farm, he meets Lia, and he is smitten. She's just the right height for him, she's beautiful, and she's kind. He longs to get to know her better and to have a piece of one of her famous pies. Maybe he has found the one person who can help him forget his painful past.

But when Lia's parents find out that she might have a beau, they send Rachel to the farm, with instructions to Lia that she is to help arrange a match between Moses and Rachel. Lia is torn between obeying her parents and following her heart. And Rachel is determined to have Moses, no matter what it takes.

I loved this book! The strictures and beauty of the Amish life are portrayed realistically and sensitively. The characters are fully developed, and I enjoyed the sweet romance between Lia and Moses. I loved the humor and upbeat feel of the book, as well as the description. But the best part of this book is the characters, all working within the structure of their way of life to achieve happiness. Anna is loveable, irrepressible, and kindhearted. She won't quit until she's got her grandson married to the right girl. Felty is this silent, tolerant figure in the background who lets the women do all the talking and then surprises everyone with his wisdom. He is amazingly tolerant of his wife's terrible cooking. Lia is an amazing person with so much promise, but she can't see who she really is because of the way her parents treat her. She has dreams. She wants to be a midwife, and she studies hard, but she has been raised to think of herself as a servant to her sister, and she is conditioned to obey her parents first. Moses shows his kindness and thoughtfulness in many ways. He sees both Lia and Rachel for who they really are, but he is not sure how to get what he wants without hurting someone. And the way things are going, he may never get a piece of Lia's pie. The midwife is a strong, outspoken woman who is not afraid to follow her own ideas. I wanted to throw something at Lia's parents for how they treat her. And Rachel is dreadful, the perfect villain for the story. She deserves a much worse fate than she gets in the end.

This contemporary inspirational romance is the first of four books about Huckleberry Hill. I can't wait to read the next one.

Moses is tall, handsome, kind, and owns his own cheese making operation, yet he is still single. He's been waiting three years for his old Amish girlfriend to return from jumping the fence to turn English. Sweet Grandma Anna has decided it's time to play matchmaker and get Moses a wife.

In response to Grandma Anna's request, Lia Shetler comes to stay the summer to help Anna and Felty at Huckleberry Hill.
