I loved this book, and loved Casey Sean Harmon's old fashioned style of writing. Took me back to my Enid Blyton days, when children's literature was pretty light hearted and there was a strong moral theme running through most. I enjoyed the plot, the characters were endearing, and the varied array of creatures living in Everafter kept the imagination flowing.

For storyline, plot content, character build and flow I would actually have rated this 5 star but I dropped it to 4 as a couple of things bothered me. Firstly editing. Mistakes grate on me when I read a book and can stop me in my tracks if I have to work out what the problem is, therefore ruining the flow of the story for me. In 'Sun dog' the author uses a portion of another chapter 'Poor Clovensport', but the two versions are completely different. Right at the point where the pirate cuts his own ear off on the bridge and falls into the abyss below. I had to go back and check the content in 'Sun dog' because I had already read that part and in my head it had registered differently, so reading it for a second time and finding a huge variance was rather disconcerting. Having said that, a child may not notice the difference.

Another thing I noticed was the the fact that it's listed as a YA novel, the main characters are 13 and 15 (with Susan the youngest being 6) but the style of writing is very much suited to Middle grade 8-12 year olds I would say. Again, only my personal opinion.

Other than these two things I would say it's up there with the best of good children's books. I liked the fact that the children were respectful of each other, and it was a cute twist with Clovensport becoming the pirate king. The ending was also nice with the absentee parents deciding to spend a bit of quality time with the kids.

All in all an excellent story, well written with great characters and a good plot. I will definitely be reading 'The tree of malice' when it comes out, and will be ordering both 'Reign of the night creatures' and 'Tree of malice' for my nephew.

In full disclosure I won this book in a Goodreads giveaway.

This was a quick and simple story. It reminded me somewhat of traditional books that I read when I was younger such as the Chronicles of Narnia or Peter Pan, where a group of brothers and sisters are whisked off to a magical land and have an adventure.

There were a few points that were unbelievable, unrealistic, inconsistent or where logic seemed to go out of the window, but for the most part I think these were only noticeable as an adult reading the book and would probably not be noticed by a child.

I enjoyed the fact that the siblings were kind and caring to each other, I also liked the strong moral theme throughout the book, emphasizing the importance of doing the right thing and working well with others.

I loved the twist to do with the dog, (view spoiler) and thought it was a really clever idea that was well executed.

The characters were interesting and fun, but as you would expect for a book aimed at a younger audience they are lacking in depth. Generally speaking day-time creatures and people are good and always do good things, and night-time creatures and people are evil and only do evil things. I would like to have learnt more about the characters thoughts and what motivates them especially Viktor and Prophet, who we only learn a little bit about.

The creatures in the book are typical creatures found in fantasy novels, especially those from Greek mythology such as griffins, centaurs, dragons, phoenixes and a giant octopus.

The book is presented in a lovely way; there are a few pictures throughout, generally showing the characters in the story. The footers on each page as well as the breaks that show a change in the POV are artistically done.

Personally I would say this book was aimed at the younger end of a middle-grade audience (8 to 10 year olds).

The ending was lovely and a good lesson for parents as well as children.

I gave this book 4 out of 5, I probably would really rate it as 3 1/2 in terms of how much I enjoyed it. But my ranking reflects how much I think I would have enjoyed it if I was in the target age group.
