My rating is 5 out of 5 stars.

I really was not quite sure how to explain my fascination with the story told by Amanda Tru. There are many aspects to the novel such as time travel, a mystery, romance and the constant change of direction in the novel. As I continued to read, I could tell the intensity of the tale was slowly escalating as well as some of the secret characteristics in a couple of the characters I sensed more than read in any description.

I sensed there was a bigger story behind what I read; I am not sure if it was due to the intervention by a male character, who is a doctor befriending Hannah because she experiences time travel or if he really loved Hannah. The antagonist in the story is easy to notice, but what devious evil plan might she have towards Hannah? Hannah is the only character who travels in time and some of her actions later on begin to bother her greatly.

The story is for older young people with some of the “kissing” scenes I came across, nothing x-rated but teens are already hormonal and need to read stories that help encourage them to not rush a relationship.

There are six books in all in the series, and I am quite curious to see where it all ends. Terrific story telling is involved and quite captivating all the way through; I couldn’t put it down until the very last page. Now I want to grab book two to see how this all progresses and if there is, in fact, a mystery involved or a different crafty ending! This is a very intriguing tale with eclectic characters and an ending that is still veiled. I hope you enjoy the series as much as I believe I will, especially when I read the final installment and all the hints come together to form a complete picture.

Wow!! This mesmerizing story of time travel by Amanda Tru starts out with a terrible accident that Hannah Kraeger happens across on her way up a mountain. It proceeds from there to a roaring crescendo, as my heart was racing with questions and details, and abruptly stops like a sheer drop-off. A most compelling reason to go out and buy the rest of the series, but this time, I'll be prepared for roller-coaster emotions that are brought to a sudden stop. I will be prepared.

After miraculously rescuing a family on a snow-bound road, Hannah discovers that no one local knows of the accident happening that night...but an identical one took place, five years before. This was Hannah's accident. Hannah is able to track down the charming and handsome doctor who was involved in saving the family's lives, as well as the family themselves. Great connections are formed, and electricity sparks between Hannah and the doctor, Seth. Unfortunately, Seth has given up on finding his angel of mercy and is now

engaged to cold, calculating Katheryn. Before Hannah can sort everything out, she time-travels again, and life becomes complicated as the reader anxiously awaits for the next disappearance of Hannah.

Great, totally believable characters in an incredible situation. Good study questions at the back of the book with Scripture references for aid. Secondary characters are planted who will more than likely have their own time in this series, and I can't wait for each story to find fruition.

The big question of the book seems to be, should Hannah use her knowledge of the future to change the past, and thus, the future? Not a lot of mention about God, but Seth does say he believes "God had the foreknowledge of how I was going to mess up and was big enough to handle turning my faults into something good." So we are encouraged to believe that God can take our mistakes and use them in His ultimate plan.

I typically don't read a lot of fantasy, even Christian fantasy, but this book intrigued me, and the synopsis sounded fascinating. I found that I really enjoyed this break from my usual genres and I would happily read this author again.

This book is written from a first person perspective and we view the entire story through Hannah's eyes. That is unusual and difficult to do well, but Tru succeeds. It was a very effective storytelling technique and plunged me into the action from the first pages. I found myself unable to put the book down for very long, utterly engrossed in the developing tale.

The characters are realistic and interesting. Hannah is confused as she tries to understand what is happening

to her, and her panic issues give her a depth that I did not expect in this short novel. Seth is an honorable man, keeping his promises even if it means the loss of a dream. The secondary characters are harder to pin down as they change a bit with the alterations in the timeline, but I would say they are better understood as the tale progresses, making them more fleshed out as we went along.

The idea of time travel and its repercussions is very complex and sometimes hard to wrap my mind around, but the author seems to have thought things out well—it all made sense, even if it took me a few times of rereading certain passages before I could understand it! I hadn't anticipated the author addressing the immense responsibility that might be involved in time travel or the moral and ethical dilemmas in how Hannah's choices shape the future. And I appreciated the affirmation arising out of it, that God knows our mistakes and can use them to bring about something beautiful.

That's not to say that this book was perfect; it had its hiccups, but it didn't ruin the story for me. There were several typos in the first few chapters, which was frustrating. There was one spot where the term "Zen-likeness" was used, and although I understand the idea the author was trying to convey, I would have preferred the use of a different adjective given that zen is a concept from another religion. It also seemed artificial to me that Seth and Hannah had such a strong connection so quickly into the story, but shock and being thrown together in an intense situation can form a relationship rapidly.

Despite these minor issues, I would recommend this book for teens on up, especially those who might be fascinated with the idea of time travel, which is explored in depth throughout this novel. And I loved the moments of fairy tale meets reality—for example, their quickly formed, strong love contrasted with the flaws they find in each other as they really spend time together. This is a very enjoyable quick read and I look forward to reading the rest of the books in the series.

She meets Seth McAllister - a medical student who is staying at the lodge - who treats Hannah for shock, then puts her to bed.

The next morning, Hannah wakes up and is desperate to learn about the condition of the family that she saved the night before. Her sister Abby and her brother-in-law, Tom are delighted to see her but are equally convinced that no such earth-shattering event happened when Hannah arrived the night before. There is no Seth McAllister staying at the lodge, no blinding snowstorm, and absolutely no car accident that could have injured four people.
