What I love about this style: combining texture, pattern, and color. What I don't love: the clutter. More is not always more, and I'm not a fan of collections. And wallpapering one's fridge? Nooooo. (Most decorating books actually have several common elements that I think make all their spaces look appealing, regardless of style: natural light, mirrors, clear floors, and fresh flowers.)

I like this philosophy: "The bazaar look cannot be bought on one shopping trip. It grows organically over the years, with finds gathered from diverse sources. It celebrates the beauty of our everyday possessions, too -- almost anything can look striking when thoughtfully arranged and given room to breathe -- and loves color." I also like that the author has a section specifically about lighting ("built-in fixtures are complemented with quirky lamps, mismatched shades, and fun fairy lights") -- it's surprising how few books mention lighting when it's so essential.
