I think that, had she had a very diligent editor/beta reader, this could have been miles ahead. What she has here is very promising, but it's only skin and bones (to me). Had I been the beta, I would have pushed for more descriptions, more varied language-- not just "she did this, she did that, she said this, he said that"-- but actually **SHOWING** the reader what is happening, what they are feeling, without having to flat out, baldly state it. That's the art form of writing. Getting the point across with a look, a touch, a sound, a smell.

There were some errors that would not have been picked up by spellcheck alone, like the misuse of slang phrases-- ones that people say all the time, but rarely ever see in print. Things that should have been caught by an editor.

I think, had I the opportunity, I would have pushed her farther than she went with this book as it is right now.

I think with the right people, and with her ambition, she can do so much better than this, and I believe one day she will.
