The Kween's intro comes across in a very storytelling-esque way. It rolls off the tongue, like we're sitting next to the fireplace or on the porch.

If you are the type that is mainly focused on a lot of sex, like over the top, hardcore porn type, I will let you know this isn't the story for you. You may not even care about the plot, the dynamic or how the story ended. If this is you, then definitely skip. I wouldn't want you to be disappointed.

But for those who like plot, relate ability, sensual, slow brimming intense episodes...well that is Ninety Days.

And that is what I dig.

I liked this story based on the way I could relate to it as well as the way it was told. I dug the way it made me think.

I would have loved to have gotten a bit more description of what "Big D" looked like, although I did pick up he was chiseled by the way "Melissa" described him.

Wow. I don't know how this went so wrong so fast. Somewhere along the way I missed the story. I'm a little bewildered at not really understanding what the hell happened... This is a poor example of erotica.

However, this hasn't stopped Kaylani from spying on and fantasizing about Ryan and having him for herself. When she spots Ryan and a group of friends she's determined to make him want her.

Of course after her performances he stops by her house and they consummate this new relationship that they'll embark on.
