This is apparently my first novel by Amelia Bishop. A Goodreads recommendation caught my eye, and that's why I bought it.

It's hard to say why I gave it five stars, other than I just really enjoyed it completely in a way I rarely do. Bishop's writing is simple and elegant. Her characters—from the central protagonists, Vince and Salil, to the supporting cast—are all people and not just types. The paranormal aspect (witches, fae) is treated matter-of-factly, and the visual details are beautifully crafted to create vivid impressions that enrich and color the background to the story.

For all the arcane goings on in “Water Witch,” (visions, precognition, magic spells) it is overall pleasantly low key. The one great moment of emotional crisis struck me as both a surprise and inevitable. The young water witch and the young water fae begin the book as pretty outlines, blurry around the edges; then gradually they fill in and take on more detail and sharper focus, until each is a fully-realized, understandable man, whose entire life is within the reader's grasp. The author presents emotions in a way that makes them truly moving and not just words on a page.

There is an overarching theme of destiny in “Water Witch,” which, far from removing interest from the inevitable outcome, actually makes that inevitability more powerful. Vince and Salil are not just passive recipients of their destiny: they must work for it, must change themselves to get where they are supposed to be.

This could have been a bland, sweet little fairytale of a story; but instead Bishop has given us a rich narrative

of emotional development and active acceptance of one's place in the world.
