It was a pretty short, simple story. Hero becomes injured in the middle of nowhere and happens upon the heroine's cabin. Heroine is very apprehensive since her safety and security out in the mountains is fragile but decides to take a risk and help. It has a little drama but for the most part a really great story.

I liked Genevieve and Alex. Both were hiding from their past, trying to ignore issues from letting them move on. Genevieve was great independent heroine. Extremely caring, not overly emotional/dramatic, she was a very level headed heroine. She has a horrible past with the town and really has no reason to trust Alex. Yet Alex is...Alex. You can't help but fall for this guy. He is so incredibly patient, gentle and kind. I loved him the minute he jumped onto the page. These two share some pretty sexy scenes together too.

There is a slight paranormal element to it...it's a huge part of the heroine's story, but it not the center of this story. Some minor (very minor) details were a little too convenient for their situation but if you suspend belief just a bit it works out. I wish I could pin point more details from the novel to really review it, but there really isn't much more to this novel. All I can say is EVERYTHING worked. The characters, the development of their relationship, their conflict, the resolution. (Btw, the ending was SO SWEET!) I loved all of it. Highly recommend this novel.
