So many good reviews, so I won't go over the plot again. In a nutshell, this is a story with a virgin heroine, who is shy and starved for love getting the man of her dreams - only to find out that he was blackmailed into marrying her by her guilty grandfather. That the hero is also in love with the heroine is painfully apparent to the reader, but he is very slow to acknowledge it because his Sicilian pride demands that he have revenge against the grandfather for blackmailing him. Of course the heroine gets caught in the middle of all this and feels more unloved and betrayed than ever.

I do wish that LM had shortened the scenes leading to the marriage (like the wanna be OM on the European trip had too much page time) and had milked the angst when they were in the middle of their misunderstandings. The walk without answering her phone and the hero's frantic worry, were a good start - but I wanted more of this.

The love scenes were lovely and effective in showing just how good they were together and the language felt specific to these characters. (So many love scenes feel generic - their wedding night felt like \*their\* wedding night - not any other billionaire/virgin combo).

I wish there had been more of a grovel at the end - it did feel a bit abrupt. But this is an excellent HP and one to be re-read with pleasure.

An alpha hot Sicilian billionaire H, the grandfather's business partner who has occasionally noticed the inconspicuous h for past some years – maturing from a quiet schoolgirl to a quiet wallflower.

The wily grandfather sets a snare to force the H to marry the gd. The proud Sicilian writhes and fumes but can't get out of it, so sets out to woo the (not really) plain jane h.

The h is skeptical but gives in to his persistence.

Post Wedding bells and honeymoon ecstasy, the H has reason to believe that the h was complicit in the trapping (of him)!

So, lo and behold, the Sicilian vendetta! (Which was more of a damp squib and more in the way of cutting his own nose and all.)

**What I liked –**

All that went on till here, even the angry H's revenge and ways to get there.

**Where it failed –**

The h has apparently *always loved* him, but when he does start wooing her, she wonders if she really wants to marry an Italian guy and lose her independence. That was a bit contrary for the unassuming and adoring h.

Getting the story to a climactic precipice, the author took the way of a gentle settlement instead of going headlong into drama filled confrontations (where the h flees in pain and disillusionment, and the jerk has to work for it). So, an almost non- grovel as she dint seem to want one. She was already in pink-ponies-and-babies-land!

I mean he was cruel and cold to her, and blamed her constantly but she never thinks of leaving him even once. Not even when she had a valid reason to believe that he was cheating on her (which he was not, of course).

Lastly, the H accused the h of machinations and took the offended moral high, but the h (or the author) never call him out on his own cold blooded reasons for marrying her!

Luciano diVilario has always been curious about Hope, the shy and innocent granddaughter of his business associate. The kiss at midnight had only been meant as a token so that Hope would not be the only woman standing alone but the sweetness of her had made an instant impact and the kiss had turned passionate. Seeing that passion, Hope's grandfather does the unthinkable; he wants to give Luciano to Hope and the only way to do that is to blackmail the younger tycoon into marrying her. The Sicilian is not ready to settle down but cannot risk the threat the old man has made to force the sale of the shipping company Luciano's grandfather had started. Though shy, Hope's determination to make her own choices proves to Luciano that she has no knowledge of the blackmail and he knows with their passion he can make a marriage work. Until he over hears part of a telephone conversation between his wife and her grandfather, and now believes she not only knew about the blackmail but had been a party to it. With his pride hurting, Luciano seeks revenge.

Blackmail is such a tough concept for me in a romance. How does one get over the betrayals and the ruthlessness of it? Well, if you read this book you'll know in a heartbeat. Luciano has no objection to his bride; he's happy in the marriage though he doesn't realize that part of the happiness is that he loves her. His pride is what does him in. Hope is surprising. She's the shy and innocent young woman that has been the object of pity and ridicule by her grandfather's social peers, and yet with Luciano she shows that she's not easily manipulated nor is she a doormat. She brilliantly stands up to him and puts him in his place. And when

she learns all the facts, she sets aside her hurt to understand what the facts mean. That doesn't mean she lets Luciano or her grandfather off the hook. These are great characters and they are so wonderfully matched. I hope these two get revisited in another of Lucy's books
