This was a pretty good reader. Most kids will like one or more of the "stories" contained in this book.

Story one is a zoo story where the child reads animal names. The pictures are well chosen. The animals chose were mostly good. Sometimes it is hard to find an animal that starts with challenging letters like x and q. For some of the letters they had 2 animals and 2 pictures. Some of the animals are not ones that students would readily recognize, like the jabiru, but maybe you could use that to do further study of that animal for science class.

Story two is a little boring. Counting. There are two pages for each number: one with the number word and the number; the next with the number, the amount of dots for that number and a picture of a hand with the number of fingers being held up. It would be good for preschool, but too simplistic for the Kindergartners, I think.

The next story is Blast Off about a rocket taking off and is more boring than the counting story, but kids will probably like it because of the rocket.

Story 4 is about feelings and is very good. These will definitely be sight words for the children but it is well done and children need to talk about and understand their own feelings about different things. This could be a good jumping off point for more talks about our feelings.

Story 5 is "I Like" and is simple sentences with pictures that kids will like and should be easy for Kindergartners to read.

So, it's pretty good and I would use it with my children.
