#### Personal Response

I really enjoyed this novel. I was always on the edge of my seat, it was hard to put down. It was full of action and suspense, and I was never bored reading it. There was almost never a time when there was a dull moment, it was always interesting. I give it five out of five stars.

#### Summary

The book starts off with Alex crashing into the ocean from space after his last mission of destroying the Ark Angel space station. He landed off the coast of Australia. He was picked up by a nearby US carrier and taken to Australia. After recovering for a few days, he was approached by the head of an Australian special operations unit known as ASIS. The man said they needed Alex to help them find out more about an organization known as Snakehead. The mission would be quite simple, Alex would be flown to Bangkok where he'd meet with the agent he'd work with, then his appearance would be altered to make him look like an Afghan refugee. Alex needed to look like this because Snakehead deals with smuggling people into different countries, including Australia. Alex and the agent who he was working with would be smuggled into Australia from Bangkok so ASIS would know who Snakehead smuggles people in. Alex didn't want to at first, but then he was informed that the man he'd be working with was his godfather, Ash. Alex then agreed, and he was flown to Bangkok. From there he met Ash, had his appearance changed, and then moved into a small one room apartment where they'd meet the Snakehead people that would smuggle them. When the Snakehead operatives arrived, they wanted Alex and not Ash to come with them for something, but no one knew what. Alex didn't have much of a choice, and went with the men. They brought him to a boxing ring where he'd have to fight someone and Alex would most likely die, that's what they wanted. Alex ended up fighting and almost was done for when he decided to cheat and managed to escape the boxing ring building. Alex then dragged himself back to the apartment Ash was at. After that, Ash didn't know what they should do. Soon, they went to an airport and they were on their way to Indonesia. On the plane, Ash told Alex more about his father Alex never knew about. When they arrived in Indonesia, people from Snakehead were there to pick them up. Ash and Alex were taken to a shipment yard, where again Alex was taken away from Ash and stowed away in a shipment container. Alex knew that this must be how people were smuggled into countries. While aboard the ship in a container, Alex was able to escape with some tools he was given by MI6 at another time. From there, he snooped around the ship to see if he could find out more about Snakehead. Alex ended up finding the man in charge of Snakehead, Major Yu. Yu had stolen a bomb known as Royal Blue and was smuggling it somewhere where it would do catastrophic damage. After this, Alex hid on the ship until they arrived in Australia. Alex was able to escape off the ship undetected and made it inland to Australia. There, he contacted Ash and told him where he was, and Ash said he'd be there soon, but something sounded a little off in the way Ash spoke. Soon, a car arrived and Major Yu stepped out with Ash, who was badly beat up. Yu demanded Alex show himself or he'd shoot Ash. Alex had no choice. Yu then knocked him out and took him somewhere. When Alex awoke, he was invited to lunch with Yu, and that was where Yu told him all this plans with Royal Blue and how it would kill thousands. He'd place it under the seabed and the explosion would cause a tsunami that would reach Australia. After telling Alex all this, Yu said he'd be taken to a remote area in the jungles of Australia where he has a team and a hospital that will take and sell his organs on the black market for money. Alex was taken there immediately, and as soon as he arrived he knew he needed to find a way out of this place before they cut him open. Alex ended up being able to escape thanks to a well-organized plan that went extremely well. After his escape, he was able to contact MI6 and they picked him up and took him to ASIS HQ, where Alex told them everything Yu was planning to with Royal Blue. Within the hour, they had a task force team set up ready to infiltrate the oil rig

that Yu said he'd be. Alex had to go with, because he was the only one who could stop the Royal Blue bomb. The task force managed to parachute onto the oil rig, and Alex ended up finding the room where the Royal Blue control panel was. He and another MI6 agent breached into the room, and the agent managed to shoot one of the two men in the room before he was gunned down by Yu. Alex stood there in shock, as did Yu. The man who had been shot by the MI6 agent slowly turned around. It was Ash. It turned out Ash worked for Yu the entire time, and he betrayed Alex. Ash tried to apologize, but he died from being shot. Alex didn't care anymore that his godfather was dead, because he killed Alex's parents. As Yu was about to kill Alex, an explosion knocked him off balance and he dropped the gun. Alex quickly grabbed it, but Yu had already made a run for it. He escaped onto his yacht and began to drive away. Alex went to the control panel. The bomb hadn't reached the seabed yet, and Alex clicked the detonate button, because there was really nothing else he could do. The explosion caused a wave that chased down Yu in his boat and knocked the entire thing over. Yu was killed almost instantly. Alex had done it again, he saved thousands of lives.

### Characterization

At the beginning of the book, Alex wanted to get back to England, but ASIS had other ideas. Alex didn't want to work for them for anyone ever again, he just wanted to go back to being a normal kid. The only reason Alex agreed was because he would work with his godfather Ash and he could hopefully learn more about his parents. It seems that Alex's luck level equals Tintin's as he is able to survive against impossible odds. Of course, being a James Bond inspired story does allow for this sort of thing, but I did find the waterfall scene perhaps a little bit of a stretch. The hospital scene was particularly dark for this series but did show the increased level of threat that the snakehead represented.

This edition had the bonus chapter 'Coda' telling us how 'it' happened. Although it did flesh out the sentence that described the scene a little, it didn't really tell us anything already stated or implied in the original sentence, except perhaps add a little ambiguity to certain things.

This edition also featured an afterword by Anthony who revealed the origins and thoughts behind most of the names from the series. This was a nice touch.

Personal Response: I enjoyed the book *Snakehead* by Anthony Horowitz. The story line was very intriguing and easy to follow. The author has captured the emotions of a teenage boy very well, and it's very easy to relate to the main character Alex.

Plot: After a previous mission, Alex had landed in the ocean near the Australian coast. An American aircraft carrier had picked him up, where he was brought to mainland Australia. Being a spy, Alex was recruited by the Australian Secret Service to infiltrate the Snakehead, a huge underground crime organization in Southeast Asia ran by Major Winston Yu, an English-Chinese crime boss based out of Britain. To accompany Alex, the Australian Secret Service had recruited his godfather Ash, who Alex hadn't seen in more than a decade. Ash and Alex travel to Southeast Asia disguised as an Afghani father and son being illegally smuggled to Australia by the snakehead. While in Southeast Asia, Alex gets picked by the Snakehead to fight in an illegal fighting ring, against a larger, adult boxer. After defeating the boxer and burning the fighting area down, Alex is brought back to the apartment him and Ash had been staying in, but he had gotten Major Winston Yu's attention. Alex and Ash are transported to a harbor, where Alex is loaded onto a container ship while being hidden in an intermodal container, but Ash is gone. After the ship sets sail to Australia, Alex sneaks out of the container and explores around the ship. After Alex snooped around a bit, he found Major Winston Yu, some crew mates, and the captain of the ship looking at a container. After closer inspection, Alex learns that Major Yu stole an experimental British bomb and was going to use it to cause a Tsunami. The reason Major Yu does this is because there is a G8 style summit going on on a nearby island, where major celebrities are meeting together to solve world problems. The effects of the Tsunami would also take hundreds of thousands of lives on the Australian coast. After the cargo ship lands in Australia, Alex gets off the ship and contacts the Australian Secret Service and informs them about Major Yu's plans. A special task force is sent to the location of the bomb detonation an offshore oil rig in the ocean. The Special Task force and Alex deactivate the bomb, but Major Yu gets away in his private Yacht. The Yacht was found, and Major Yu had died from injuries he sustained from the fire fight on the Oil Rig.

Recommendation: I recommend this book to any teen, specifically from 13-17. The book is action packed and fun to read at any time.

Normally I read these books to entertain myself. I know the danger is fictive and I know Alex Rider will always come out of his life-threatening missions alive. So I don't bother to imagine an outcome with Alex Rider on his deathbed, because I know that will never happen.

Still, this story terrified me. We're not in Kansas anymore. What I mean is that the missions are not so easy anymore. In the past, Alex Rider had needed to infiltrate a boarding school, pretend to be a member of a couple of families and track numerous people. I now look back on some of his previous missions and find them rather childish compared to this one.

Because the evil organization Scorpia is a living nightmare. They do all sorts of illegal stuff, like fights, smuggling, assassinations and human and organ trafficking. The moment you mention human and organ trafficking to me, I am going to start taking you very, very seriously. For the first time, I was scared for Alex and was not entertained one bit. I mean, the story is captivating, but there wasn't a moment where I was able to smile or laugh. The atmosphere is also darker than in the other books.

It all felt so real. Too real to pretend it's just a story. Even Alex felt that because he was less (but still a little bit) reckless than in the previous books. Some people mentioned this fact in their reviews: Anthony Horowitz's stories are methodical. You know MI6 will make an appearance sooner or later and you know Alex will escape sudden deaths in many unrealistic ways. More often than not, people don't kill him because they are too fascinated with him. The way Alex carries on his missions is also quite planned.

But I've gotten used to it so I don't mind. If, however, you prefer a series to REALLY progress and introduce original new elements and characters, well... I still recommend it. I usually wouldn't, but I believe Alex to be a character worth getting to know. He doesn't age, which I find most peculiar, but fortunately, he is already mature. Plus the actions scenes are well-written and surprising.
