I know some of us find it extremely sweet when heroes go all alpha and tell the heroines they can't wear something in public because it hurts them! God knows I sometimes found it sweet! But that's really domestic violence 101 if it is allowed to be moved further.

This hero encourages the heroine to dress according to her beauty not hide it and buys outfit that might be a little risqué? Yes, he had an agenda of flaunting his beautiful yet caring wife in front of his terrible ex. But he grew up and grew out of that phase even before it kinda started.

Now we CAN argue that by encouraging her to dress provocatively his fulfilling some other kind of fantasy and treating his wife as possession. Let me just give you my opinion, it didn't feel like that to me, because when the heroine questioned his motive behind buying such outfit he was very clear and honest. He knew she was confident to wear it, she can afford to wear it given her appearance and she'd look unworldly, so why not buy it and why not encourage her? And that proves that he doesn't treat her as a possession rather a partner he's proud of. And nothing wrong with being happy with your partner's beauty. It was neither shallow nor superficial.

It is at that moment the hero realizes he loves his wife of six months and that he never knew anything about her traumatic first marriage and miscarriage. The heroine wakes up feeling insecure and powerless - and is relieved to know her first is dead. Then she has to learn to trust the hero all over again and to trust herself.

Hero is great. Heroine is great. The H/h deal with some serious subjects (the corrosive power of jealousy), but the overall tone is not angst.
