She was going to visit a sick friend and could not wait to warm herself by the woman's fire! Unfortunately, with another hour and a half to ride, a few snowflakes started to fall. The storm was getting bad, the wind howling. Fortunately, she heard a voice calling to her and Tom Brewer, the local blacksmith, rode up to her. He told her how bad the trails had gotten, and they headed toward an old rundown cabin for shelter.

A stream they had to cross had risen waist-deep and Tom walked the horses through as Rosalie pulled herself high on the saddle to keep dry. Tom was half frozen and almost losing consciousness by the time he made it across and remounted his horse. She helped him inside and got him under blankets while she built a fire in the dilapidated cabin. The Miners to Millionaires series is an ongoing saga that takes place in the town of Promise Creek, Montana.

When a miner, Ivan, sent off for mail order brides, he didn't just send for one. When nine women showed up as his mail-ordered brides, they will learn of the deceased groom. The women will live in his home, and one by one are being courted and married. What starts out as a mail-order fiasco has slowly worked out for many of the other women, and the various single men in town and each book will read as a stand-alone as part of this series.

Rosalie Davis chose to become a mail-ordered bride, leaving her family in Ohio and seeking an adventure in the west. While her intended groom is no longer in the picture, she has decided to remain in Montana rather than returning home to her parents, and five older and over-protected brothers. She has made friends, especially with the other ladies who also arrived as a bride for Ivan.

The plot will have Rosalie traveling on a sunny day to visit a friend, and the day changes quickly with a whiteout snowstorm. As luck would have it, another traveler, Blacksmith Tom Brewer comes across Rosalie and together they must trek to a trapper's cabin to seek shelter.

The story will have two people who are virtually strangers, relying on each other to survive the storm, watching out for each other, and working together as a team to stay alive. What these two did not count on was how easily they could communicate with each other, sharing family details, and developing a friendship. But what happens when it is more than friendship developing? Tom hasn't considered finding a wife and having a family. Rosalie proves she is resourceful but is also an innocent. They must remain neutral towards one another because they don't know how long they will remain isolated.

"He had saved her, taken care of her, made her feel safe in a terrifying situation, and had made everything all right. He had treated her with kindness and respect, never one taking advantage of her, and he'd made her laugh."

How can two people who are starting to develop feelings keep things from going too far? Rosalie feels Tom is pushing her away and feelings are hurt.

"Most of the sting of his rejection had eased, but not all of it. That wasn't possible, not when she wanted so much more from him than he was able to give. He wanted friendship, but she wanted him."

The story is a clean historical romance that shared the challenges of two people doing their best to survive the elements, the lodging situation, finding food, avoiding predators, and protecting themselves from human desires.

This is the story of Rosalie (one of the famous Ivan mail order brides if you have been following the series, but if not it doesn't matter it can be read as a stand alone) and Tom the local blacksmith. They were on the way back/ to visit the same friends when they got caught in a whiteout snow storm and managed to find each other and a cabin in the woods giving them a bit of shelter. Crossing the lake with the horses, freezing in the lake, exceeding close to hypothermia and frostbite and needing each other's body warmth, they somehow survived their first night. The adventure continues with being attacked by a wolf, and losing their horses they become closer than ever and resign themselves to trying to survive winter in the woods. Although the chemistry between them is hot Tom wants to wait until they are back in town for proper courting but

misunderstandings occur with neither side explaining their feelings and thoughts well to each other. A simple decision to ride out to visit with a friend doesn't usually end up being a life changing event. Unless you head out on a chilly morning only to miss the signs in the sky that say a blizzard is heading your way... and you're all alone in the wilderness.

Rosalie and Tom's romance is just as much about survival as it is about their attraction to each other. Being caught in the blizzard deep in the forest is the first problem, the conditions of the old cabin they found shelter in is another, add to that one lone wolf who has stalker-ish tendencies and you've upped the game quite a bit. I enjoyed *A Mail-Order Dawn*, it's a more intimate setting for our couple but it also gives them a better chance to get to know each other under intense circumstances. For most of this story we'll only see Rosalie and Tom... and a few horses and one determined wolf.
