It is hard to write about a novel such as this when it is so good and part of such a superlative series as is the Bolitho series. This is historical fiction at its best.

As Kent moves along in his series about Richard Bolitho, it is evident that it is less and less about battles at sea, but more about personal relationships, about trust, about loyalty, about friendship and about love. This is certainly true of this book.

Bolitho, promoted now to full admiral, is assigned command of the North American squadron, patrolling the Eastern seaboard of the United States from Halifax to the Caribbean. War is in the air, and it seems just a matter of time until it breaks out in full force between Britain and its former colony.

The novel brings to closure some of the relationships that have developed: Zenoria, wife of Rear Admiral Keen and loved by Adam Bolitho; John Bankart, Allday's son. It begins new relationships also: Allday has a daughter with Unis.
