One ice storm later Kayla is stranded out in the middle of nowhere where she meets the grumpy Brent and the dance begins. Lovable characters (especially Ruby) and a sweet love story - I give Her Unexpected Detour two thumbs up!

Here's what's going on: Kayla's been accused of pulling a prank that could cost the advertisement company she works for their biggest client. Although Kayla wasn't the one who doctored the ad, yet she's the one that's been put on unpaid leave for a week. Deciding to take a detour on her coffee break, she ends up heading out of town to visit her brother where she runs into a handsome yet surly man who ends up coming to her rescue when she crashed through a fence.

All Brent wants to do is help his grandmother get her bed-and-breakfast spruced up in time for it to reopen, make sure his cousin doesn't force his grandmother into selling, and stay away from the sexy brunette who seemed to find a way into his heart. Yet Kayla's here's to stay, at least until her car's fixed. Although now

that he and Kayla ended up in bed together, he can't get her out of his mind but she's intent on leaving.

I liked Kayla. I really enjoyed watching her come into her own as the story unfolded. She's had a tough time of it lately, she knows someone set her up at work but she's afraid to say anything about it because she doesn't want to upset her father who got her the job. When she first meets Brent, she gets the wrong impression of him and instantly butts heads with him. She's suffered loss, so rather than opening up, she keeps everyone at arm's length.

I received an ARC of this title in exchange for an honest review and here it is.

This is the first novel I've read by Kyra Jacobs and I found it to be a well-written and very entertaining one.

Her heroine, Kayla, who works for a large advertising agency is put on a one-week suspension without pay after someone sabotages one of her ads for a major client. She's so distraught over the suspension that she gets in her car and drives, heading off to see her brother, a mechanic, who lives three hours away in Mount Pleasant. She stops at a diner for coffee, and literally bumps into our hero, Brent Masterson, the first of the coincidences that bring these two very engaging characters together. Shortly thereafter, Kayla's car ends up in a ditch after skidding on the icy road, and Brent comes to her rescue by taking her to The Checkerberry Inn, which is owned and operated by his grandmother, Ruby, who is perhaps the most endearing character I've come across in quite some time.

Both Brent and Layla are wary of relationships, both of them having experienced major losses in their lives, but these two wounded and emotionally closed-off souls were meant for each other, and the charming secondary characters in this novel, Brent's cousin Miles, Ruby, and Kayla's brother, see it clearly, and are not afraid to try to get Brett and Kayla together.

This is a sweet and charming romance, about happy and unexpected coincidences, and a very nice introduction to Ms. Jacobs writing. It reminded me of Robert Frost's poem, "The Road Not Taken," which is high praise indeed.

But soon she finds herself driving away from her town and arriving to a small café to meet her brother. After the two talk about what she is going to do next, her brother leaves and she is soon on her way back to her home, but she gets caught in a snow storm. Without a car or anywhere to go, she gets picked up by Brent Masterson, who she also had met at the café hours before. He offers to drive her to a small inn and soon their attraction grows as the two start to spend time together.

For Brent Masterson relationships are not in his life plan, but the minute he sees Kayla he starts to feel attracted towards her and soon the two spend the night together. But things quickly change as the two learn more about each other and spend time with their families. Although they are focused on jobs and have no time for a relationship, it is evident that they both have to let go of their pasts in order to move on.

I really enjoyed reading their story, it was interesting how they met and how Kayla ends up at Brent's grandmother's inn. His grandmother is just amazing, she loves the inn and having to see it struggle hasn't been good for her. Kayla's arrival ends up helping them as well and we get to see their interactions as well. Kayla is starting to realise that the company she works for really don't appreciate her talent, honesty, skills and hard work - especially after a nasty prank played on her lands her in hot water! Suspended for a week without pay, Kayla is understandably upset so goes to get a coffee locally but instead drives three hours to meet her brother in Mount Pleasant. She goes for a coffee and ends up literally bumping into a tall, handsome stranger who grabs her to stop her falling, getting her clothing dirty. Then there's a horrendous ice storm which lands her in a car in a ditch and her stranded on a country road. That's when that same stranger from the coffee shop, Brent Masterson, turns up to rescue her! He takes her to his grandmother's Inn - Checkerberry Inn - where she's invited to stay until her car can be towed out again. He's Brent Masterson the attraction between him and Kayla is hot and mutual but she's only there for a night and Brent's previous relationship trauma make him extremely wary. Can love find a way to bring the two together?

The similarities between Brent and Kayla, both endeavouring to avoid relationships, having not really overcome the grief of losing a parent and having close family support all add to the drama of the story. It is a relatively quick but very enjoyable read and I really hope this isn't the last we hear of them, Ruby, Miles and Tommy as well as what happens to the Checkerberry Inn! I've yet another author to keep an eye out for - this is the first book I've read from her but I'll certainly want to read more in future.
