I was okay with the addition of Bryon and his age play but it didn't seem to totally fit the story for me. Maybe the story just went in too many directions for my taste. I did not care at all for the introduction of Suzanne as an Auntie in the age play business. That is a personal quirk of mine I know. I don't care at all for any F/F action in any book. I couldn't really get into this book at all.

It felt rushed. The story develops incredibly fast once it moves past the first few chapters. And it's like there's too much story to cover, too many characters to introduce and develop, and too few pages to do it all in.

It just doesn't make me care for the characters at all when, for example, Cassie goes from being a fairly normal teenage girl to wanting a master, daddy, teddy bears, and what not, and somehow mentally welcoming it all as exactly that which was missing in her life, in the time span of a few days. If I have to accept all that, it has to be written so that it seems plausible. It didn't. Instead, it made the character have no actual identity at all. She is just whatever the particular scene demands her to be.

The whole love aspect didn't work either. It just felt like taking advantage of a vulnerable girl under the

pretense of love, but with the intention of satisfying sexual needs.

I had a few issues about this story, and surprisingly not one of them had anything to do with this being age play. In fact, I think Cassie made a great little, so I can see how this would be an excellent story for those who really enjoy reading about someone just settling into their "little" lifestyle.

No, my issues ran a bit deeper. To me, this was DUB CON-NON CON all the way, and I'll explain why. When we meet Cassie, she's a 20 year old brat, living at home with her pseudo brothers, while she attends college for a culinary degree. To call her a brat is really an understatement. Truthfully, she's too stupid to live with a maturity level of a twelve year old. This assessment is reinforced time and time again in pretty much every behavior and decision she makes.

Now, I don't care how many times she calls these three men (Bryon, Rob, and Glenn) her "roommates", it doesn't change the fact that their father took Cassie in twelve years ago to live with them and be a part of their family. Every party involved agrees on this: **they're family**. They grew up together. She calls them her brothers. They call her a little sister. And it all gets wrapped up into one big ball of squick when it turns Daddy/ sexual. There's a line that needs to be drawn, because this story is just one step shy of that no-no sibling line I don't like to cross in my reading travels.

Bryon and Rob have decided the best thing for our bratty Cassie is a good spanking, and they've agreed amongst themselves that Bryon will be her Daddy and Rob will be her kinky lover. And this is where the Dub Con- Non Con came in. Every time they took the dynamic/ relationship further for her, Rob would say "We'll give you plenty of time to think about it" or "We don't want things to go too fast" which sounds consensual, until you read the very next line.

Suddenly "We'll give you plenty of time to think about it" turns into "Get naked and on all fours Cassie"

SMACK "you're getting an enema." And "We don't want things to go too fast" turns into "Hold her down, naked and spread out, Bryon. I'm going to go down on her without telling her first." I don't think Cassie is mature enough to decide if this is a lifestyle she wants, and even if she were, they completely overwhelm her life and neither gives her a moment to decide for herself.

If you're reading this, thinking "Oh God, two brothers **at the same time?** then this sentence should solidify in your mind whether this is the book for you (view spoiler) Because if you like a bit of sibling taboo with your Dub Con – Non Con, then this could really be the book for you.

Now for the technical: There are multiple shared points of view in this book, and while the author did a pretty good job of blending them, there's no way of getting around the fact that shared POVs can get confusing. I'm personally not a fan of that style. Secondly, the grammar and formatting of this, at least for my edition, really needed an editor. I lost count of how many times words ran into one another. Last, but not least, there's no plot to speak of. (But it's not as if you were going to read it for its riveting plot to begin with *smirks*)

The age play aspect was well done, it's just the consent and familial relationship that threw me off. Needless to say, this wasn't the book for me, but it could be for you.

Now Fast Forward 12 years. Unfortunately, Cassie's mother has died and she is out of control. And Bill is off to Japan to shoot commercials during all of football season - I didn't get that either. Leaving Cassie home with the boys - except they are 34, 31 and 21 - but still boys.

And what Bill doesn't know is that Rob and Bry are Doms of a sort. Rob is into the whole Master/Slave Dynamic and Bry is heavily into ageplay and wants to do the whole Daddy/Daughter thing. So they get together with their two step-sisters and...

Oh, right, they only have the one. Silly me. So they get together with their one step-sister and...

Having Rob and Cassie become a couple was one thing. Having them do the whole Master/Slave thing went a little further. Having Rob and Cassie and Bry do a Dom/Sub-Daughter/Daddy thing simultaneously, I found a bit odd. And I think Bill would have, too. If he had found out, there would have been some serious 'splaining to do.

As an introductory story into Domestic Discipline and Ageplay, I thought it was pretty good. The convoluted interpersonal relationships I was never quite sure about. I did always feel like Rob and Bry always had Cassie's best interests at heart (more than once they made sure she okay with what they were doing) and they were definitely a positive influence for her.

The final chapter I assume was written before the sequel was planned. Which I will have to read at some point.

To say that the writer hit EVERY cliché possible in creating a BDSM story involving an inexperienced girl, experienced men and introduced pathology into the reasoning for her NEED for the action contained in this book would be the best way to describe it. Because this is a "book club" selection for a group to which I belong, I am hoping that my review will either spare some people or engage others...either way, feedback from others after finishing would be appreciated.

For those who remember my review of the 50 Shades series, you will recall that I read critically. The Game Plan is a step above "one-handed fiction" and is better than it might have been precisely because the main female character's flaws, used to justify the actions taken with her, are made real enough for a critical eye to accept. Breanna Hayse, put another way, might actually be better than E.L. James because she can, in a short effort, draw a broken character and not make the pathology so hideous as to cause the reader to pity her. The reader can appreciate Cassie's "issues," understand how, in the framework of the narrative, her brothers reach the decisions they do, and, as long as age play floats your boat, connect with how she responds to her brothers' actions.

I give three stars not because it is bad or because it is good. Frankly, age play does nothing for me and in fact

is a distraction. I give it three stars because I found the characters rather fleshed-out for a 103 page book (at least on the Nook). If I had to give my review a title, it would be "Characters drive a ho-hum narrative, enjoyable but not excellent."
