This book is an amazing book about Bluestar (a cat in the warrior's series). It starts when her eyes open and ends when she becomes leader. She has lots of struggles including losing her mom AND sister! Although she has a tough life she figures out how to keep pushing on. She is a determined cat who destined to greatness.

It all started in the nursery when Bluekit opens her eyes and saw the world for the first time. Then once she becomes apprenticed a prophecy that says "you will blaze through the forest like fire, but beware for even the strongest of flames can be destroyed by water" takes her off course. Then later in the book (when she becomes a Warrior) the deputy retires to the elders den, and the clan is in need of a new deputy, and she is determined to be that deputy. She then steps up to do all of the duties in the clan to show the leader why she would be the best deputy (she even sacrifices her kits). Then when it is time to pick a new deputy the leader chooses her! She then serves her clan with her life. Then the leader dies, and Bluestar (used to be Bluekit then Bluefur) becomes the leader. Towards the end of the book a sign is shown to her medicine cat who tells her "Fire will save the clans". Bluestar thinks and thinks about it then one day she sees the answer. She sees a kittypet (a household cat) out on his fence and his pelt reminds her of fire and realizes that he is "the fire that would save the clans"! That's where the book ends and you'll have to read Into the Wild Book 1 to figure out what happens next!

I like an unambitious lead, but she was the opposite.

It was the worst, probably, of the Special Editions, at least the ones I've read, and I don't have any particular sympathy for Bluestar after reading it. The only part I liked was the little epilogue, with Spottedleaf and Bluestar, and Rusty, and the whole 'get Graypaw to track him' thing. By the way, why in later books are apprentices not even really allowed out alone, but in this one they're being sent on missions next to Twoleg-place, or whatever they called it?
