This book was an emotionally powerful read, and I loved every minute of it. Every time I was able to pick it up again, I was pulled back into Logan and Lisa's story as if I had never left.

Logan really grew on me in this book. In the first book, I wasn't a fan of his--he seemed arrogant and snarky. In this book, however, another side of him is revealed without his personality getting lost, and I had suspected a more vulnerable side was probably there all along, just covered up with arrogance. Ok. This one annoyed me a bit more than the first. I won't go into details to spoil anything, but an event happens, miscommunication is spread all around, there's manipulation going on between pretty much all of them, and instead of just letting things go, Lisa decides to make Logan's life miserable by tattling everything he does to Logan's mom for two whole years. And then instead of coming clean when they started dating, she keeps it quiet.

For ease of reading, to I'll summarize my annoyances:

-Logan forgiving Lisa so quickly, while good, annoyed me -> Because she ended up doing nothing other than saying sorry for what she had done, and I feel like in reality, there needs to be some restitution of some sort to right the wrong you did to someone, regardless of the state of their forgiveness towards you, but she overreacted to a misunderstood event, after two years realizes she was wrong, he finds out, she says sorry and that's it. Nothing done in any way to attempt to make what she did right at all (some might say he needed to do that to fix what he had done, but SPOILER btw, as we find out, he hadn't actually done anything wrong at all this whole time)

-Lisa forgave her friends without any consequences either for their much bigger and way worse slights. Now I'm not saying she shouldn't have forgiven them, however, what they did in comparison to what Logan did was way worse, as there was a life long relationship with them (technically when the event happened, Logan and Lisa weren't even friends, and that is not including the fact that the slight Lisa felt didn't actually even occur). What annoyed me about it is the ease in which she trusted them again. Once again, there were no actual attempts made by the friends to fix what they did, nothing that they did after the big reveal of everything made her trust in them realistic. Trust is freely given until there is a reason to withdraw it, and then it must be earned, however, there was no earning of the trust back, she just gave it and they jumped right back into the relationship they had before. Realistically (meaning how I would have reacted), yes I probably would have forgiven them, but I would not have called them my best friends, and would have asked for space and there wouldn't be the closeness from before. And then one of them betrays her even worse shortly after her forgiveness and she is once again all it's not his fault. Hence I am of the opinion, that once trust is broken, it needs to be earned or people don't learn their lessons. They had crossed a line, and then weren't given any consequences for it. Not ok.

As such, I felt that this book was a bit of a let down, as apparently Logan's "slight" was worthy of destroying him for two full years, but her friends' very real, very nasty betrayal that just kept coming was worthy of complete forgiveness and no hard feelings. In my view what the friends' did was way worse than what Logan did, especially since it wasn't actually what had happened in reality and (spoiler here) her friends knew it. Felt a bit double-standard to me, and while I get that it is hard being super close with people to not just go back into a relationship with them, at the same time, I felt that her trust should have been broken and while she forgave them, if it had been me, I would have asked for time and space to see if the relationship could be repaired, no way would I have just jumped back in. I felt that Logan's reaction to her betrayal was more realistic as he took time to figure out where his head was, and while I wasn't happy necessarily because of Lisa's not fully making her mistakes up to him, I was happy with his overall reaction and how he handled things.

So in the end, not as enjoyable as the first was, and therefore one star less than the first book got, as the only characters I really liked were Lucas, Sarah and Logan. Logan deserves someone who is willing to make an
