In this charming and poignant novel, three sisters, Caroline Marris, Gracie Gold and Sam Carter revisit Nantucket to share once more in the fond memories from their childhood and the passing of their mother. Her mother had always dreamed of one day owning the now vacant Misty Harbor Inn, and restoring it to the grandeur of the Inn it

once was.

Now that the three sisters are in their later years, Caroline and Sam feel a pull to resurrect the dream of their mom now that the Inn is for sale and is in need of much renovations. They feel if they can all pool their mother's inheritance money than they wouldn't have to finance the Inn and could own it outright, but Gracie is resolved to not get involved in the purchase because leaving her home would mean giving up the memories that she shared with her husband who has died. Seaside Harmony is a story about three sisters meeting in Nantucket for a 2-week vacation. They have rented a house together and this visit is the first time they have returned to Nantucket since their mother died. This is where they used to vacation as children and the memories flood back as they visit old haunts. One of their favorite places, Misty Harbor Inn, has fallen on hard times. This was the place to be seen at when the girls were young and on vacation. You were really something if you could afford to go there. Their mother dressed them up and took them there for tea. What the girls remember most is that their mother's dream was to own and operate an inn like Misty Harbor. She shared this dream with her girls, telling them what she would cook, how she would decorate and other details. Maybe they can just take a look inside and that will satisfy them...or maybe not.

As the story progresses, Caroline, the oldest at age 61, decides she wants to buy the inn to make their mother's dream come true. She has never been one to follow through on her ideas, but always been a free spirit. She has a history of getting everyone excited about some idea or another and then when everyone got on board, she was off to something new, leaving everyone else high and dry. This especially upsets Gracie, who is just a couple of years younger. Gracie likes everything in order and in its proper place. She is a list-maker and likes to keep on-task to get everything done on her list. Sam, who is the youngest at 52, is the peacemaker. She has always adored Caroline and wanted to be just like her big sister growing up. Caroline wants her two sisters to pool their inheritance money from their mother together with her own to buy the inn. Sam soon comes around to Caroline's way of thinking and decides to invest. Gracie, however, is a much harder sell. She eventually agrees to invest her money as well, but refuses to sell her home in Maine where she lived with her husband for 40 years. Her husband died three years ago and she still misses him terribly. They are able to buy the inn and they are soon immersed in cleaning, painting, stripping old wallpaper, finding hidden treasures and searching the old mansion for secret rooms. They discover some old postcards addressed to the wife of the man who originally built the house. The postcards are from 1878-1880 and from a man named William. Hannah is known to have mysteriously vanished from the house around 130 years ago, but no one knows what happened to her. Can the sisters solve the mystery? What do the mysterious numbers on the back of some of the postcards mean? Can they work together despite their personalities? Can they really make their mother's dream become a reality?

When I started this book, I didn't think I was going to like it, but I kept reading and the pages started turning quicker and quicker. I liked reading about the relationship of the sisters and how their skills really complemented one another in making the inn a home and in resolving their arguments. I really want to find out what happened to Hannah and can't wait to begin the next book in the series, Sunflower Summer. This is just a charming book of the love of three sisters for each other, their mother and a dream. They work hard to make the dream come true and to make a mansion feel like home.

Evangeline Kelley is the pseudonym for the "writing team" of Patti Berg (who had been MIA for quite a while), Pam Andrews and Barbara Hanson (apparently they write as a team inside this team), and Camy Tang. I have no idea whether the authors tackle a book each or write each one together, but I can tell you that Seaside Harmony is the first of three books in the Postcards From Misty Harbor Inn series. Oh, and this is a Christian romance, so naturally it takes place in a rustic island, as we all know that Christians only live in bucolic, island, or seaside landscapes.

Oh, and I have better let you guys know as well - the story continues throughout the series, so you would need to get all three books if you want to know the whole tale. There is no indication of this anywhere on the front or back cover, and there isn't even any indication that there are other books in this series anywhere in this book. Maybe all that information is pasted on church boards all over the place and, therefore, a heathen like me is out of the loop.

Basically, we have three sisters: Caroline Marris, Gracie Gold, and Sam Carter. They are in their fifties and they haven't been together much lately, until their mother's passing shortly before this story begins. They spend eight chapters walking slowly all over the place and talking about mundane things, before deciding to buy Misty Harbor Inn, a resort that their mother loved but had been purchased by some people from outside of Nantucket Island, whose plans to upgrade the place were met with massive disapproval by the locals.

Since our sisters are locals, of course everyone is pleased that they are buying the place. The sisters spend the next dozen or so chapters agonizing about their decision when they are not still walking slowly and talking about mundane things, most of which they should already know so who knows why they are rehashing everything out loud all over again.

Then crisis strikes when Caroline decides that maybe she should spend the money elsewhere, earning her her sisters' ire, and she spends the next three hundred chapters flailing - as if she'd just realized that every part of her body has cancer - and wailing that she needs a sign from God to tell her what to do. I sincerely hope no real life people of any religion gets this melodramatic over purchasing a property, because it's embarrassing.

And then, finally, after so many chapters of ramble, I come to the cliffhanger ending. I've never been so excited to see one in my life.

As you can probably tell from the previous paragraphs, Seaside Harmony suffers from a lack of direction for almost the entire story. It's ridiculously slow, and every other scene seems suspiciously like padding. Reading this book is like reading day-to-day journal entries by a random stranger, and this is only palatable if that stranger lives a life full of explicit sex, fantastic violence, or other fun things. Here, however, it's all small talk and aimless chatter as the story creaks and groans its way slowly to the last page.

There is some mystery about the disappearance of a widow in the 1880s that used to own the building that eventually became Misty Harbor Inn, but it's developed in equal slowness. It has to span across three books, after all. I'm not exactly jumping at the edge of my seat wanting to know what happened to her.

The three sisters lack any distinctive trait, other than Caroline is the one who has a male BFF - it's BFF because we can't have anyone joining body bits unless God decrees them to, after all. These sisters are sort of just there, existing to complete each other's thoughts like badly written characters tend to do. Also, they are in their fifties, but they exhibit a bewildering kind of naïveté that is more at home with sheltered kids. For example, they are shocked that they have to do a lot of work to renovate a building that had been allowed by previous owners to fall into a state of disrepair.

Seaside Harmony is way too slow to be interesting, and it takes forever to actually get anywhere. And when it finally goes somewhere, it's right to a cliffhanger ending. What the heck is this? Still, as Jesus-approved sleep aid goes, this one is probably safer than sleeping pills.

I will leave this at three stars because I couldn't finish the book. I really didn't like any of the three sisters, the writing was okay at best, and I felt more like I was watching Antiques Roadshow than anything else. Not worth my time to finish.

Three sisters vacation together in Nantucket after their mother's death, to reconnect with each other. When one suggests they use their inheritance to buy a rundown Inn from their childhood and start the Bed and Breakfast their mother always wanted, they may end up even farther apart than before they set out.

I loved this book because I've sometimes wondered myself, "Why not start a B and B? How much fun would that be?" All three characters, Caroline, Sam, and Gracie, have believable reactions to the idea: enthusiasm, a more tempered idea, and skepticism. Each has a distinct personality and their interaction as sisters was believable.

The plot was well paced, though a little fast towards the end. I also would have liked to see more description of the actual house, to have a better idea of what it looked like beyond "Victorian." There are only a few instances of faith being discussed and mentioned, and in a general way.

I would recommend this to readers who enjoy a contemporary tale with a hint of mystery.
