Stirring Up Trouble (Rosewood #3) by Andrea Laurence is a great story for those who like the opposites attracting trope, and how the main couple trade insults at one another, which is actually a type of foreplay for both. This was a very uber-cute small town romance with a stuck up heroine who falls for the seemingly blue collar worker who eventually steals her heart. A very light-hearted tale with a few awww worthy romantic gestures from the hero that will make you smile.

The heroine Maddie is a prim and proper, pearl clutching type of woman, who comes from a very well to do family. She's pretty much daddy's little girl, and a former mean girl in high school. But Maddie is very different from when she was a teenager, which you see right from the start. Maddie has been given many things in life but she wants to prove she's a hard worker and not a spoiled rich girl. She owns and runs her own bakery, and gets up at the crack of dawn to bake and create tasty desserts her small town community will love. She also bought her own house, on what she thought was a desirable, but quiet street. Unfortunately for her, Emmett owns the bar right across from her house, and because of his rowdy patrons, she can't get to sleep. She makes sure he's suffering as much as she is and calls the cops on him, which happens to be her brother.

Emmett is more than annoyed by Maddie because he ends up paying a fine every time she calls the police. She wants his bar closed by 10pm, which he can't do because he makes most of his money then by having live bands and a big crowd. He thinks Maddie has a big stick up her butt. She may think he's low class, but Emmett hides a big secret. Let's just say he left the stress of his old job to open a bar in a small town. But Maddie is about to ruin everything for him. Even her brother is fed up and ends up handcuffing the two together, in order for them to work out their problems. When that doesn't help, they're both arrested and must work community service together.

Not only are Maddie and Emmett forced to be in each others company, there's a graffiti artist spray painting huge penises on town landmarks. Maddie and Emmett decide to try and catch the criminal, aka The Penis Picasso, which leads to some late night detective work, which helps change their opinion about one another. Both are attracted to one another, but they're like oil and water. Emmett is fine with keep things under the radar so Maddie doesn't have to answer to her family and snooty friends, but as she and Emmett grow close, she wants to date him out in the open. But Maddie has been burned by men before because they only dated her for access to her family and fortune. Can she trust Emmett not to break her heart? And will Emmett reveal his secret to Maddie so they can have a clean slate and work on a future together?

Stirring up Trouble is a fun read. It's a bit loopy and slapstick, but it has a lot of heart on the pages, especially with the cast of characters Emmett and Maddie interact with. Both have great chemistry and their personal issues are solved in a way that should please readers. Emmett's one big romantic gesture for Maddie is very swoonworthy and romantic. It deals with the Penis Picasso, and how Emmett does a little graffiti of his own to show how much Maddie means to him.

Madelyn Chamberlain has always been known in town as one of the mean girls so when she opens her bakery, she knows that she has to change. Maddie has also purchased a victorian home which she adores - except for it being opposite a noisy bar called Woody's owned by Emmett. Because she owns a bakery Maddie has to get up very early to start her baking for the day and having a bar opposite is not what she needs - so war starts when she reports Emmett for noise pollution to the police, and this is where the games begin.

Emmett is not happy when the police arrive and fine him for the noise that any bar produces and knows instantly who reported him, he is not happy but pays the fine which turns into fines as Maddie keeps reporting him. They end up arguing in front of the police and are then arrested for disturbing the peace, they are then charged and up in front of the judge who tells them that they have to complete community service TOGETHER to pay their debt.

This is where the combustible chemistry, humour, friendship starts to develop, secrets are revealed and Maddie has her eyes opened to certain aspects of what your actions can cause.

I loved the style of Andrea's writing, how she kept me entertained with all the other goings on in this book. The characters in the book are all great and I could not put this book down. So I would definitely call it A MUST READ for romance lovers out there.

I enjoyed this book but it took me a while to like the main character Maddie. Maddie has been spoiled all her life by her Dad and her family's wealth. In high school Maddie was a mean girl who enjoyed being cruel to others. But when her heart is broken by a guy who was after her money Maddie is determined to never get hurt again. But as Emmett falls for her, she began to soften a bit and she began to grow on me. Although i did find myself fascinated by the entire Chamberlain clan. This is the first book that I've read by this author, but I'm definitely ready to learn more about them. It was very telling about her character that even her brothers couldn't stand to be around her for too long. The only reason I kept at it was Emmett.

Maddie is the mean girl who grew up to become a mean woman and while she's a very talented baker and her pastries are to die for, her behavior leaves a lot to be desired and no one knows that better than Emmett Sawyer, the owner of the local bar. Since Maddie moved in across the street, Emmett has received enough citations for noise violations to paper his walls and very soon their feud lands them in front of the judge. Slapped with an order for community service, Maddie and Emmett must serve it out together or get thrown into jail for contempt of court, a fate worse than death for two people who can't stand each other.

In *Stirring Up Trouble* we get Maddie's story, who I was excited to read about, and also cringing, because she wasn't the nicest character in the previous books. I will admit, at times, especially during the beginning, I found it extremely hard to like Maddie's character, but as the book grew on, I ended up liking her more and more.

Maddie starts a war with Emmett, the local bar owner, for disturbing her sleep at night. With her waking up early and going to bed early, the noise coming from the bar each night is driving her nuts. She's used to everyone cowering down to what she wants so when Emmett didn't back down, things got interesting. Emmett isn't a fan of Maddie's, he calls it like he sees it, and believes she's a stuck up snob who believes the world should bow down to what she wants. He's met girls like her before, and isn't about to let her walk all over him. When he doesn't back down, and they end up in a screaming match, they are brought in and forced to do community serviced together.

The chemistry between Maddie and Emmett is definitely hot, and I wanted them to give into what they both wanted, but enjoyed the wait that Andrea Laurence put us through. Maddie and Emmett start to open up to one another, and they both learn that there is so much more to each other, then they originally thought.
