Faith McCabe's fifteen-year old half brother, Nicholas, --the only good brother Faith was closer to even though he lived with his mother two towns away-- was missing for three days and Faith comes to her ex, Ryder

O'Brien, for help in finding him.

Ryder is angry on seeing her because three months ago she'd ended their affair with only a post-it note to him then showed up in town within a week of their break-up with a local bad boy, following that by dating several other men within a span of one month. He wants nothing to do with her, let alone help her in finding her brother. In her desperation Faith blurts out that she's pregnant with his child.

The O'Briens and Mcabes have a deep seated enmity for years. While the O'Briens are well-liked by all the locals, Faith's family are not liked at all. Moreover, while the O'Briens were a close knit family, Faith's family comprising of her parents and three brothers were the total opposite. Faith has been living with her parents only to protect her mother who's been enduring her husband's philandering ways for years but was too weak to leave him.

Ryder had just learnt that his parents had been murdered when he'd run into Faith who he found was like a light to his lost and lonely soul. They started secretly spending time together, rendezvousing at Ryder's fishing cabin until Faith left him.

From the very beginning Faith had known --also Ryder-- that there could never be anything more than an affair between the two of them. When Faith found out she was pregnant, she panicked knowing her family would give her hell or they would kill Ryder first. Also, there was a chance that Ryder, being a honorable man, would propose that the two of them marry for the sake of their child and she didn't want to do it because she saw how her mother suffered having married her father for the same reason. Which is why to throw everyone off the trail she'd dated those other men after her break-up with Ryder. She hadn't meant to blackmail him with her pregnancy, but he was the only man she trusted enough to ask for help however seeing his stubborn refusal to help, she couldn't help blurt it out.

With his child at stake --of course Faith's life too, which he never wanted to admit-- Ryder gets on board to find Nicholas. But his task was made difficult with the various hurdles he has to tackle such as Faith and Nicholas's mother, Celeste, being constantly at loggerheads with each other, add to it kidnapping attempts that were made on Faith not once, but twice, also Faith falling sick right in midst of their investigation because of the pregnancy for which she has to visit the hospital. This was one of the few rare books where pregnancy symptoms was interwoven into the suspense making the pregnancy feel real unlike some books I've read where the pregnant woman does all kind of stunts that would put Superman and other superheroes to shame. Even though Faith did get into action, she was sensible to take her rest and see the doctor from time to time. Also, after the second kidnapping attempt, she went with Ryder to live at his ranch without any argument or resistance. At times, I didn't agree with her decisions or thought process, but considering the kind of family she had, I could sympathize with her.

Then, along with the lurking dangers, Ryder and Faith had also to deal with the strong feelings ---there's no doubt that both had fallen for each other hard the first time they were together-- and sexual attraction they still have for one another and Ryder's future role in their soon to be born child's life.

I liked how the O'Briens jumped to rescue, opening their home to Faith despite their dislike for the McCabe family, showing her what a family who sticks together can do and making her rethink about the plans she'd made for herself and the baby that didn't involve Ryder. Unfortunately, Ryder got to know of her plans before she could change them and that hurt and angered him. So, once again there was a strain between them. Surprisingly, the person who comforted Faith during those anxious times was Celeste. I liked how the two of them came around over the fear of losing the one common person they both loved - Nicholas.

I loved Ryder. Liked how sensibly he dealt with the news that he was going to be a father and although he was hurt and angry he didn't make threats on Faith. I liked how he decided to first investigate about Nicholas and then deal with the fact that he's going to be a father in four months but he was definitely going to be in his child's life, which is why I could understand his anger when he learnt of Faith's plan to relocate with their baby to another city. And, I liked after the initial anger how they both talked about it, with Faith apologizing and he telling her what he wanted for the the two of them and their baby. Loved the scene where he was searching for Faith despite being half-dead when the EMTs were working on him.

I would recommend this book to anyone who likes a good, emotional, angsty romance interwoven with suspense and family dynamics.
