THE CRACK was listed for a First Reads giveaway by 45th Parallel Communications. The novel begins on New Years Day, 1976 in South Africa so although the reader already knows, the author repeatedly reminds us that this is not going to be a good year. What does the crack in the swimming pool represent? I initially assumed that it symbolized the destruction that apartheid--the cracking of society into two separate groups--wrought. But by the end of the novel the crack has grown to encompass the breakdown of a family, the "crack up" of at least one character, serious physical injuries and death, and the splitting open of the body in more than one sense, as well as a crack in personal relations caused by an evil Iago-like character. The increasing enormity of cruelty and evil on the part of the Afrikaner police officer, who initially is just doing his job, is nearly unbearable and, of course, is not something he can limit to his place of work. A powerful novel, definitely worth reading.
