This was a really cute story that dealt with one of life's eternal complications.... the old "who saw him first" conundrum :-P Friends have that unwritten law about never, ever going remotely close to someone that a friend fancies, but what about family? Isn't it just the worst scenario to fancy a guy that your sister fancies? You'd think a brother and sister may be safe from this little problem, but factor in the *minor* detail of sexual orientation and all of a sudden things get helluva complicated!!

Ryan met Brady 8 years ago at college. The attraction was instant and mutual. Brady was a single dad, so (of course) Ryan jumped to the wrong conclusion and assumed he was therefore straight. It never really occurred to him that Brady could be bi. Brady, sadly, never really tried to convince him otherwise – despite the fact that the more time they spent together, the bigger the attraction became. Then the worst of the worst happens Brady meets this "bangin' chick" ... yep, it is Ryan's sister Ellie. The three of them strike up this weird friendship – like a mutual appreciation society - but *he* saw *him* first, dammit! See what I mean??

Com.Plicated!! Brady knows that Ellie isn't for him so he isn't exactly heart broken when she dumps him. And off to Phoenix it is, for Brady and his daughter... on his last night in town he *finally* gets to make out with the guy that has been his crush for the last 3 months!! Yes. Ryan. Of course they both feel guilty as hell so don't stay in touch – and now 8 years later Brady is back in town. Naturally Ellie wants a second crack at the one that got away. Will Ryan ever tell her that he also fancied him, and that *he* saw *him* first, dammit! Plus Ryan is just such a nice guy – who honestly wants his sister to be happy, forgoing his own shot at happiness, even. But dammit Ryan.... YOU SAW HIM FIRST!!! CLAIM HIM!!! :-P

The rest of the story I will leave for you to discover – it is a lot of fun though!

I really liked this story and was saddened to see that for some reason the book has been removed from some book sellers – I am not going to lie; there were some pretty bad errors in the book. Wrong names or words being used, but these errors should have been picked up by people that proof read or even the beta readers – not all the blame can be laid on the author, how often do you spot other peoples mistakes, and skim over your own? I would *hate* for this author to feel discouraged and to stop writing, as he really has a wonderful writing style – just maybe check, check and check again before putting the book out to an often nasty and vindictive reading public.

I struggled with rating this book -- I liked the basic premise behind the book, and was prepared to enjoy it. It had decent ratings here on Goodreads. But there were sooo many problems:

1. The characters were supposedly Southern, but the accents were inconsistent, sometimes none, sometimes Southern, sometimes West Virginia, and sometimes African American. It was annoying.
2. Brady's 14 year old daughter tells Ryan (to try to hook him up with her father) that if he "got a dick up his ass it would get the stick out of it". Ugh, no. If a kid really said something like that about her father, I would suspect sexual abuse.
3. Brady's mother also encourages him to pursue Ryan by lifting up his shirt to show off his ass in front of his daughter. The nurse calls him a hot piece of ass in front of the daughter. Really??
4. Ryan was an idiot about not wanting to date Brady because he had dated his sister in the past. Despite all his friends telling him to talk with them about it, admitting to himself that he should talk to them about it, he chooses not to. And not for any particular reason. It seemed that the author just wanted to drag out this story by saying the same things over and over. There were so many opportunities to make these characters real, and they were all missed.
5. There are typos and omissions throughout. This book was very poorly edited.

I made it about 90% of the way through (I hate to give up on a book), but in the end, I was just too irritated to take it any further.

So, sorry, I'm going to say it. This was just really bad, and the author had the bones of a decent story there, but that editing...

I don't know who looked over this, but there should have been several other people or someone else entirely. Spelling mistakes, character name switch outs, missing words, tense issues, etc. And this wasn't every blue moon. This was close to nearly every page or so. Then there's the content.

Aside from that, I just wasn't invested in the characters or the plot. I don't like flashbacks, especially when they continue over and over within a novella, even alternating POV. I don't like when the flashbacks are repetitious, either. The plot needed to be bulked up with *new* events or ideas to keep things fresh.

The humor was sorely lacking. I didn't even crack a smile once, and I get that the main characters' thing was awkward humor, but this just didn't work for me.

I loathe masturbation scenes, but at least this one wasn't in the shower. Still, the sex scenes weren't hot for me, so they felt like throwaways. Clichéd phrasing such as: "...*coming unglued in my hands.*" Or "*I felt myself coming apart at the seams.*" Even the orgasm seemed very unsexy to me: "*I'm coming. Jeez.*"

That sister annoyed me beyond reason. Flighty, selfish, and one-dimensional. She really was only in the novella as a way to provide a way to bring the couple back together after years apart and to provide imagined tension. How hard would it have been for Brady or the sister to quickly tell Ryan there was nothing between them and there never really had been? It went on and on, which just felt repetitious and unnecessary.

Then there was the Big Misunderstanding that I'm never a fan of in my books. During a flashback, Ryan and Brady kiss and fool around the last night Brady is in town before he takes himself and his daughter out of state. Immediately after the sexual activities, Ryan flees in the night, and Brady takes off the following morning. They don't speak again for seven years, and low and behold they are neighbors in the same apartment complex. And I simply don't understand how Brady could have been comfortably bisexual hanging out with a comfortably out gay man for a couple months, attracted to him, and never once did the topic of his bisexuality come up in conversation. Yet, they were best friends... Also, if Brady was genuinely attracted to Ryan, and had never brought up his attraction why on Earth would he think dating Ryan's sister (and not having sex with her, really what was the point?) be a smart idea?

The writing felt simplistic and very much like a first draft, and like I said above, with another round of edits - both copy and content - this might have worked better for me.

Ryan and Ellie Borja share more than just blood, they also happen to be attracted to the same man. Brady Novak stormed into their lives eight years ago when they were in college, then blew out just as quickly several months later, taking Ryan's heart with him. Brady was graduating and had landed a great job that would give him the ability to support himself and his young daughter, Delila. Miscommunication and Misunderstandings led Ryan to believe Brady was upset over his breakup with his sister. When in fact, Brady was more upset because he was losing Ryan.

Time heals all wounds, and over the next eight years Ryan got over Brady, or so he thought. Until his sister shares the news that Brady is back in town, worse still, she has a date with him. Old feelings that Ryan thought were long buried resurface and he's flooded with the memories he's tried so hard to forget. Ryan is nothing if not stubborn and hard headed, the more Brady tries to talk to him the more Ryan pushes him away. Add to that the precocious teenager that lives in Ryan's building who is hell bent on setting Ryan up with her dad, and these two have several hurdles to climb. If only Brady could get Ryan to stand still long enough to be honest with him about his feelings.

Boehme is quickly becoming a loud voice within the M/M genre with stories that are based on realistic life events and contain extremely likeable characters. I'm not usually a fan of angst within a storyline, but Boehme has a knack of knowing how to mold the angst into passion and love that make it bearable and believable. I think the moral of this story is to be honest about your feelings, not only with yourself but with that person as well. How do you know what he or she is thinking, if you never ask? Oh, and have some mind blowing sex and blow jobs coupled with some toe curling kisses on that journey as well, I mean what's life... without a little fun?

A little complicated? I found this situation to be completely convoluted, but needless to say things untangle themselves at the end thank goodness

Ryan works as a bartender and is very close to his sister Ellie. When it comes to dating men Ellie is a complete flake and has the attention span of a four year old, however she still has the romantic dream of true

love and being together with one person for the rest of her life. Then out of the blue Brady turns up, a boyfriend that Ellie had dumped some eight years ago and decides to give it a second go. To Ryan's horror he thought Brady had left town years ago too, but apparently is now living below him in the same block of flats with his fourteen year old daughter. Ryan's life is now sent into a flat spin.

Eight years ago although Ellie was dating Brady who is according to him, bisexual, the one person he really was attracted to sexually was Ryan. Well they have a fling just before Brady is about to leave for Arizona. Ryan runs off ridden with guilt having sex with the man his sister is dating.

Brady is back and the fun starts again, although this time Brady's daughter, who Ryan would baby-sit for back then, is now a precocious 14 year-old and decides to play matchmaker.

Let's just analyse this whole situation for a moment; sister is dating man whose brother is attracted to, brother has sex with said man and falls in love even he can't except it because his sister is going out with this guy. This guy hasn't had sex with said man's sister and only wants to be friends the second time around , but also says he's bi. Like I buy that! Brother doesn't know this and is guilt ridden for shagging his sister's boyfriend. Everything comes to a head (no pun intended-lol!) and resolves itself with said bi-man falling in love and being happy with said girlfriend's brother. Confused?

Well, the deal here for me is that anything gets complicated as soon as bi-sexuality is involved. Sorry, that may sound prejudice, but through bitter experience not a theme I feel comfortable with. Not only is Brady torn in two, but it's also the complications it causes the third parties as well. Kade picks up this theme quite nicely,

"Gay men preach all day about being tolerant but they sure ain't when it comes to bisexual guys."

This is possibly true, but I know from experience as a gay man that date or have an affair with a bi-guy, at the very worst one who is married with kids, generally you'll end up on the losing side and your dreams of a loving relationship and skipping happily off into the sunset are shattered. Therefore if you can "shag 'em and leave 'em" then fine, but if not then it all becomes *a little complicated* to say the least.

Although Brady says he's bi (maybe due to his daughter; a result of a teenage pregnancy) I never really got the feeling he was. It felt more to me that Brady was a closet gay, who thought he would never be accepted by another man with a fourteen year old daughter in tow and would be more accepted by a woman. Although all the time he was apparently doing Ellie (both times and again no relationships between) he never once had sex with her! The big attraction was / is for her brother Ryan. Doesn't sound very bi to me now, does it?

Kade creates what seems at the beginning an impossible situation, with real and authentic characters but it all unravels itself in the end. Once again two men not communicating their true emotions with each other. But then if you could sort things out with a good chat for 30 mins then it would never be a story, would it? And to be honest the latter never really is the real one anyway, is it? People talk conveniently about characters communicating, but there are so many examples in real life where communication has broken down through various reasons whether private, political or international. I like the way that this story resolves itself and everyone gets their HEA.
