ANGELESIS by John VanOrsdel sits upon a field of firm writing skills. But the story tries to bask in the blazes of science fiction, political drama, terrorist thriller, philosophical primer and spiritual enlightener all at once. After an impressive start and seventy pages of unexpectedness, the story plateaus for the next 200 pages as the author stirs his cauldron of complex ingredients into a bland stew. It is at this point, half way through the book, that I quit reading. The aliens characters lost their glimmer, the human characters lost their uniqueness, and the exercise collapsed into a long walk to nowhere.

To be completely honest, I did struggle quite a bit with this book. I think there were a few too many characters - and it was hard to be in one head and then end up in another character's head really quickly afterwards.

It wasn't until towards the end that I found the book easier to read. The relationships between the characters

were interesting, but I thought that a lot of the friendships and relationships that formed did so a bit quickly, with them being summarised more than allowed to form naturally.

Although there were quite a few parts of the book that I didn't agree with, I did think that the underlying theme was quite a good one. I think that people would benefit from learning from these kinds of morals and ethics, particularly about the fact that there are a few people who have amassed a great deal of wealth - while there are many people who have nothing... and who starve when it would be completely unnecessary for them to do so.

I also liked the underlying themes of love and acceptance, again despite not agreeing with some of the aspects of the book. I also liked the people from the other worlds - and the differences in their cultures to that of Earth's.

I did notice quite a lot of errors in the book. The word 'repaired' was used when it probably should have been 'retired'. I also had several confusing moments when I wasn't sure who was speaking at which point.

I think this book would be easier for me to read if the amount of POV characters were lessened - and there was more showing rather than telling. I found it difficult to relate to many of the characters because there were too many of them.
