Stella Starling has become a safe bet for me, especially when flufftastic M/M romance is required to calm my mind and improve my mood.

I do love me a sexy bodyguard romance and this one worked a treat. Kelly and Jase played off an enemies-to-lovers vibe well, although they were never actually that considering how gobsmacked with immediate lust and awe the men were with one another from the get-go. Their UST built slowly and surely as the story progressed and when feelings and declarations were finally made I was in a sappy-sweet happy place I didn't wish to leave.

Throughout the story, Kelly could have annoyed me with his reoccurring petulance and refusal to follow advice for his own safety, yet he still managed to endear me to him with his snarky nature and simple need to love and be loved in return.

Bodyguard Jase was just as endearing, with his lonely past and his more recent physical pains. I love a gentle giant with secret hurts and a heart of gold, who is loyal, passionate and protective beyond reproach. Jase embodied all of that and more.

It's become obvious that each story in this series occurs across the same timeline, so there is plenty of overlap in events and opportunities to see key moments and discussions through various MCs POV's across each book. The stalker storyline, in particular, seems to be the link that binds all three story arcs together, with the catalyst of all events up to this point actually occurring in the third book. It's kind of trippy when you think of it like that, but it's an interesting way to approach a series, and so far I've enjoyed how it's all played out.

Be Mine takes place at the same time as *Be True*, and while it can be read as a standalone, I recommend reading *Be True* first for best results.

I'm a goner for the bodyguard, not to mention the enemies-to-lovers, trope and this story has both, plus oodles of unfulfilled sexual tension.

Jase is Kelly's bodyguard, and he takes his job very seriously. Kelly has been receiving death threats related to bLoved, the dating site he created so gay men could find true love. A stalker is blaming Kelly for taking away his boyfriend.

The police officer in charge of the case, who is also Jase's best friend, insists that Kelly needs to go into hiding. But Kelly is the face of bLoved and about to launch a big publicity campaign. He's not happy about being stuck with a babysitter and makes Jase's job as hard as possible.

Kelly is mouthy and takes stupid risks that put both his and Jase's life in danger. He argues with Jase about everything. Jase is stoic and silent, barely acknowledging Kelly's existence, which irritates Kelly all the more.

Kelly and Jase don't like each other . . . or maybe they like each other a little too much.

Their desire burns hot and bright just beneath the surface. After such a long buildup, I expected a lot of down 'n' dirty, but, much to my indignation, this book was only moderately steamy.

The suspense/mystery wasn't really believable, but it did add tension to the story. I suspect we'll learn more in book 3, which is Brandon's (the police officer) story.

I also think Jase's disability (view spoiler) was almost glossed over. I'm glad it wasn't the main focus of the story, but I didn't believe he would have been able to hide it from Kelly for so long. And once the secret was out, it wasn't mentioned again. I was kind of bummed because I love imperfect MCs and a good dose of hurt-comfort.

Despite these little annoyances, I enjoyed this story. ***Be Mine* is a fast, fun read, with an utterly flufftastic and romantic HEA.**
