This book is part of the Hot College Daze collection of novellas, but it is also the sequel to Shawn Lane's story More Than Anything. In More Than Anything, we met Shayne and Des. In this story, we learn more about Bart, Shayne's best friend, and Evan, Des' cousin and best friend. There was some timeline overlap between the two books. This was a pretty good story, but it didn't really engage me as much as some of the other novellas in this collection. I think I liked Evan, but like with More Than Anything, I didn't feel a real connection between the characters except for a physical one. It also followed almost exactly along with the first story. Jock approaches gay college boy, gay-college boy is wary of being gay-bashed by big jock, Jock convinces gay-twink to go on date, they have sex. Many times.
