I can't help but like a book whose introductory sentence is "Things got off to a rotten start when I found Cousin Otto dead in the ladies' room." Although the writing at the onset of the book is a bit lackluster, the plot and characters are just interesting enough to hold the reader's attention until the middle, when the pace picks up and the book becomes truly interesting. Augusta's quirky malapropisms and a nicely complex mystery combine to make this a very satisfying read. Though it's not the best cozy I've read in a while, it was entertaining and I'm looking forward to the next installment in the series!
