Where do I start? I enjoyed some aspects of this book, but others, not so much. I am waffling between 3.5 and 4 stars, so I'll go with 3.75. ;)

The beginning was very good, and completely captured my interest from the very start. The characters were all quite good. I loved Istus, the main character. He was very relatable, and realistic. I also loved Taria and Thoryus. Taria was so sweet, and I loved her relationship with Istus; it reminded me a lot of my own relationship with my brothers. Thoryus was a great secondary character; I loved his sarcasm and "verbal sparring" with Istus. Definitely provided a small amount of comic relief.

My favorite part by far was the scene when (view spoiler) The emotion was incredibly well done, and I felt like I was actually in the situation. So real! I also loved the bit with the spider. Wow! So so good! The whole part was just so raw, emotional, and realistic. Just amazing! Well done!

I also loved St. Claire's writing style. It is very loquacious, and flowy. The expression, articulation and wordings were just beautiful. The way she expresses the characters' emotion is amazing. For this reason I am inclined to give this book 4+ stars.

After about 35% of the book, things really slowed down, and I found it monotonous. (view spoiler) I feel like much of that could have been cut out, and made it a much more enjoyable read. And it's not like this book is short, by any means! 50+ chapters, and nearly 350 pages. I think 50-75 of those pages could have been shaved off, and made this novel 1000 times better. I also wasn't a fan of the whole Grey Falcon thing. I think this could still have been amazing without it, or with a different variation of that theme. One last critique, I think some of the mystery elements weren't revealed soon enough, causing confusion.

The ending was very good. I enjoyed the first 35%, and the last 35%. In my opinion, the middle 30% could have been cut down significantly. The ending was a great wrap-up, the final battle was interesting. Why is that the end climax always happens at 9:30pm? I stayed up 45 mins past when I should have to finish this book! I liked the general guy (I will never be able to spell his name!). I instantly knew he was an ally. MAJOR SPOILER: (view spoiler) Man, great plot twist! And Robyn . . . *sniffs* that part was so sweet, yet sad! <3

Overall, this book was good, but had its ups and downs for me. Don't just take my word for it, check it out for yourself. :) Even with its downfalls, I am very much looking forward to the next book in the series!
