This novel by JoAnna Carl contains two chocolate stories in one book. Carl's main character, amateur sleuth Lee McKinney, keeps herself busy working as an accountant at her Aunt Nettie's chocolate candy store and also as a sleuth when need be.

Story one revolves around Mae Ensminger, a Warner Pier resident, throwing several people in a tizzy after she brings Aubrey Andrews Armstrong to town and shares he's going to make a movie of her romance novel loosely based on people who lived in the town years ago. When Silas, an older relative of Mae's is discovered dead in his pumpkin patch by Lee, things get really hairy around town. Did Aubrey, who's taken a shine to Aunt Nettie, kill Silas or someone else?

Story two kicks off with Lee's business acquaintance, Julie, being found dead in her apartment. Was Julie's death just a matter of a burglar bungling a job or something more sinister.

I think JoAnna Carl went overboard mentioning the many times Lee ate various chocolate candies to demonstrate she worked at a candy factory. A couple times would've been plenty. I did like her Aunt Nettie character.

I think this collection of two 'Chocoholic Mysteries' is probably what people mean when they talk of summer reading. Very readable, engagingly tortuous plot lines predicated on pretty unlikely events, with reasonably credible and well wrought characters, and language that won't have you reaching for your dictionary. The choc theme comes from the chocolate business which frames the lives of the main amateur snoop, Lee McKinney, and her aunt Nettie with whom she lives. It's set in Warner Pier, Michigan, a nice little American town (the kind of place where the murders they get involved in investigating would probably never happen) that gives the stories a quaint, idyllic setting. Bit like a young version of a Miss Marple novel, when I think about it.
