Luckily it was a very quick read. Cozy it was for sure, but the main characters are just so unlikable -bossy, petulant, lewd (and not in a good way) and unrealistic.

The fact that Clint is supposed to be a 'Christian' was mentioned many times, yet his actions spoke differently.

Clint and Jennifer (obviously the main characters) take over the police investigation in a blatant and unbelievable way. I know that this is supposed to be a small town, but the actions of the police chief are unbelievable.

Lastly, the author has Clint make a bit of a speech about publishing and editing and the fact that poor editing and lack of editing is making the print media go down the tubes. Yet this author made so many truly horrible editing mistakes that I just can't take him seriously as an author.

For example he talks about an ARMORED car as being an ARMED car and does this several times until a

chapter or two later when he then changes ARMED to ARMORED.

This was an enjoyable quick read. "Murder in the Mountains" is part of the Rocky Mountain Cozy Mystery series by Miles Lancaster. The Rocky Mountains are the setting for this well paced mystery. Jennifer is the owner/operator of the Aspen Breeze Lodge. When one of her maids finds a guest murdered in his room, Jennifer and her friend Clint (owner/editor of the local newspaper) set out to solve the case to save the good name of her pricey resort.

Questions abound: Why are six out of her 20 guests single? That's an easy one - they are part of a historical society looking for buried gold (from a long ago heist). Why is there no indication anywhere that the robbers buried the treasure in the mountains? Why was a second member of the historical society murdered when they went out to search for the treasure? How does a more recent heist (six years ago) play into all of this?

What favors can Jennifer and Clint call in to help solve this mystery? When and why does a "long shot" come into play? Is a Las Vegas mob involved? Why is the only female member of the historical society carrying a blackjack in her purse? Who do we believe?

The characters are reasonably well developed, and interact as would be expected. The setting is realistic, and the plot flows along at a decent pace. I found Jennifer's character to be a bit much, even for someone that was

formerly in the business world - hopefully that will be toned down in future books. All in all - a reasonable read.

It started off as quite a nice read, although there seemed to be a strange emphasis on MMC being a christian. The relationship between the two main characters was a bit odd. It seemed to be a little too buddy-buddy. Not really a romance, but also not just friends, calling each other beautiful and things like that all the time. So when the romance does come, it's no surprise, but it still feels weird. The way they think about each other just seems awkward. Oh, how they 'like' each other! No tension at all. Kisses on cheeks and foreheads, even after they are supposedly an item. Then again, this isn't a romance novel, so the reveal of the mystery could be good. I read on.

The writing is a bit odd at times: eyes as cold as an ice stream? I think the writer was trying to not be cliché by saying as cold as ice, but it feels forced. How about a crossword puzzle that is supposed to make up a picture... Hands that flow melodically over the keyboard... Things are repeated, some small talk could have easily been left out. The writing could be tighter. There's even a Frank turning into a Matt at the end. Dark hair behind black glasses? Come on, edit!!

By the end I had forgotten which name belonged to which character. One woman, easy enough to remember, one A type personality, easy to remember, but he's dead. One burly dude, easy to remember, also dead. Others, I've no idea. Motive was a good enough find, but by then I was scanning the pages. The fact that they didn't go to the police with what they found out was exactly the interference they were so against at first. Started off well, but got worse and worse.
