With a title like “Phantom Bigfoot Strikes Again” you know you’re in for a good old-fashioned romp involving a legendary creature straight out of a Saturday matinee. A small town, Big Beaver, and a teen-aged hero at the center of it all—shades of the 1950s monster movies! The book is all of that and more. Not only does it provide a fresh take on the Bigfoot legend, but the author introduces a diverse cast of interesting characters, many of them, big and behaving badly. He turns them all loose in a fast-paced farce. The book is sometimes rude and crude, but what would you expect of a bunch of folks running around in the woods in pursuit of a missing boy and the legendary Sasquatch?

Our hero, Duane, is trying to figure out what the heck is expected of him. Caught in a preposterous set of inter-special, other-worldly circumstances, that’s a pretty tall order. I have to admit that I have not read that much in the YA genre, but if the target audience for this book is the adolescent male, this book will likely hit

its mark. Getting a 15 year old boy to tear himself away from sports or video games to read is a tough thing to do. If Phantom Bigfoot Strikes Again can't do it, nothing will. Moms and Dads will, of course, want to check this book out first to determine age appropriateness, and that's a good excuse to get a few laughs in of your own. I must confess that I am a diehard fan of Trailer Park Boys, so you might want to take that into account when considering what sorts of things make me laugh. If your kid gets hooked there's a follow-up: Phantom Bigfoot & the Vampettes from Venus, with a third, Phantom Bigfoot and the Haunted House, to be released July 24th!

Author Simon Okill's PHANTOM BIGFOOT STRIKES AGAIN is about Duane Dexter, a good-looking teenager that could get just about any girl in the small Northern California town of Big Beaver situated in the Shasta Cascade Region. However, his main focus in life is being THE DESIGNATED GUARDIAN of the ancient forest in which the Bigfoot live, a job he proudly takes on. His father had run off, and with no mother

to care for him, in some ways the Bigfoot has become his family.
